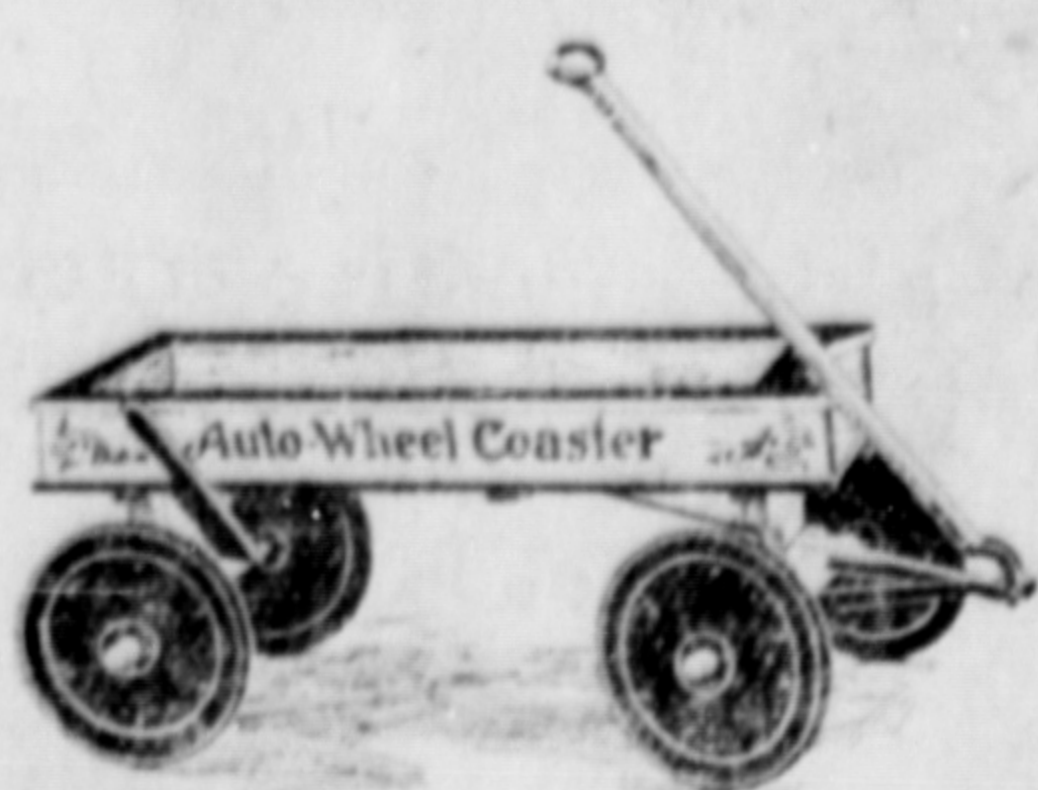

The 1923 indemnity bylaw for the mayor and aldermen was finally adopted by the council last night.

The city's \$40,000 temporary loan bylaw was given its third reading by the council last night. Next week it will be up for final adoption.

An account for \$37.52 from the Atlas Boiler Works for parts ordered for the city's larvia boiler last year was referred to the Board of Works by the city council last night for further report.

Tenders for 20,000 window envelopes were opened by the city council last night and referred to the Finance Committee for action. McRae Bros bid \$5.11 a thousand and Rose, Cowan & Latta, \$5.25.

An application from Lee Loo and Lee Hing for permission to purchase lot 59, block 5, section 2, for \$73,600, the upset price at a recent tax sale, was referred by the city council to the Finance Committee last night.

The tender of McRae Bros. of \$149.75 for supplying the literature for the municipal reading room from April 1, 1923, to March 31, 1924, was accepted by the council last night. It was the lowest bid, W. W. Wrathall's figure being \$164.80.

George D. Ireland, Vancouver relief officer, has written to the city council asking that the hospital bill and return fare of Matt Oledo, who was sent to Vancouver at this city's expense, be paid. The letter was referred to the Finance Committee.

The city council last night adopted a report from the Finance Committee recommending that a \$1000 worth of 1923 city bonds be purchased from A. E. Ames & Co., of Victoria. Payment will be made in short term Victory Bonds from the municipal sinking fund.

The pipe in question was ordered some months ago but its delivery look several months and when it did arrive from France it was ordered to be held in Seattle until further notice.

A special meeting will be held tonight in the Carpenters' Hall of all civic employees in the Public Works and Health departments affected by the recent wage revision. The chief executive board also requested to attend.
