### CROP PROSPECTS ARE STILL VERY BRIGHT

According to Report issued by Bank of Montreal

Conditions during the past week have been fairly satisfactory in the prairie provinces and prospects continue for a good average crop, says the Bank of Montreal crop report. Rust is prevalent in many parts of Manitoba and Saskatchewan but the present cool weather is expected to arrest developments. In the other provinces crops generally are fair to good. Details of reports received from each district are as follows:

**Prairie Provinces**  
**Edmonton District**—Prospects continue promising, grain lodged in places.  
**Calgary District**—Excellent conditions continue, wheat and oats practically all headed out. Harvesting should commence in three weeks.  
**Lethbridge District**—Extreme heat past week caused some damage to crops, hail on evening 20th with considerable damage over fairly extended area. Wheat coming well under way in two weeks.  
**Saskatoon District**—Owing to continued wet weather wheat not ripened as quickly as usual. Red and black rust in evidence. Slight damage from hail and saw fly. Coarse grains promise good crop. Plenty of hay and pasture.  
**Winnipeg District**—Prospects have changed considerably during the past week and South of Canadian Pacific main line damage from rust extensive over the whole district. An average wheat crop is hoped for. Barley and oats promising. Rye proving



light. Wheat cutting started in south. Pastures good.  
**Regina District**—Prospects for heavy wheat yield are not as bright as last reported. Rust spreading in northern sections of province and several points report damage from sawfly. Coarse grains will also be affected by rust and pests. Hay and pasture good.

**Quebec**  
Grain crops are making good progress and a fair yield is looked for. Hay in eastern and southern districts practically all harvested with yield above average. Roots continue to look well and an average crop is expected. Apples reported a little below average, with plums and berries plentiful. Pasture is in good condition with exception of some of the northern districts where there is a lack of moisture.

**Ontario**  
Conditions throughout the province continue favorable. A good general yield is expected. Fall wheat is nearly all harvested. Yield and quality above average. Spring grain crops, including corn, promise well, but rain is needed badly in most localities. Roots are in good condition. Most fruits above the average. Raspberries only fair.

**Maritime Provinces**  
Recent rains throughout the Maritime provinces have been good for the crops. Haymaking has been delayed somewhat. Prospects at present in Nova Scotia and P.E.I. indicate all round good crops. An exceptionally large crop of hay is being harvested and prospects are very favorable for a large apple crop. In New Brunswick hay and grass pasture show some improvement. Potatoes now growing well and a fair crop expected.

**British Columbia**  
Weather generally favorable but rain needed in parts. Grains ripening early and cutting general in Okanagan and Kamloops districts and Vancouver Island. Roots and potatoes fair. In Okanagan Valley all tree fruits developing in splendid shape, especially where trees properly thinned. Slight hail damage. Apricots and early apples moving. Berry crop below average but equally good. Pasture generally good except Vancouver Island. In north crops above average.

### FORD TO MANUFACTURE PAPER FROM HARDWOOD

DETROIT, Aug. 10.—Latest attainment at the River Rouge plant of the Ford Motor Co. is the manufacture of paper from pulp produced from hard wood by the "soda process." Heretofore soft woods have been looked upon as the only kinds available for paper. Manufacture is being carried out on a large scale, with plans under way for increasing production as soon as new equipment can be installed. The process enables the company to use all of the scrap pieces from its body-building plant at River Rouge, thus effecting a new economy in lumber conservation.

LONDON, Aug. 10.—There are 3,300 harvesters for western Canada due to leave here in three different ships between now and Sunday.

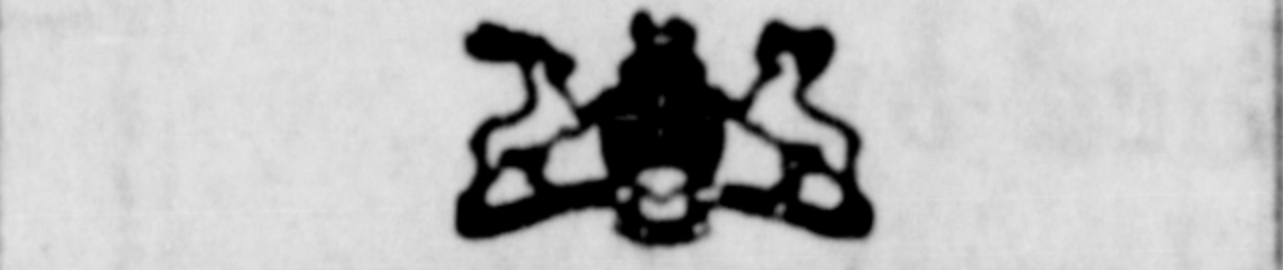
