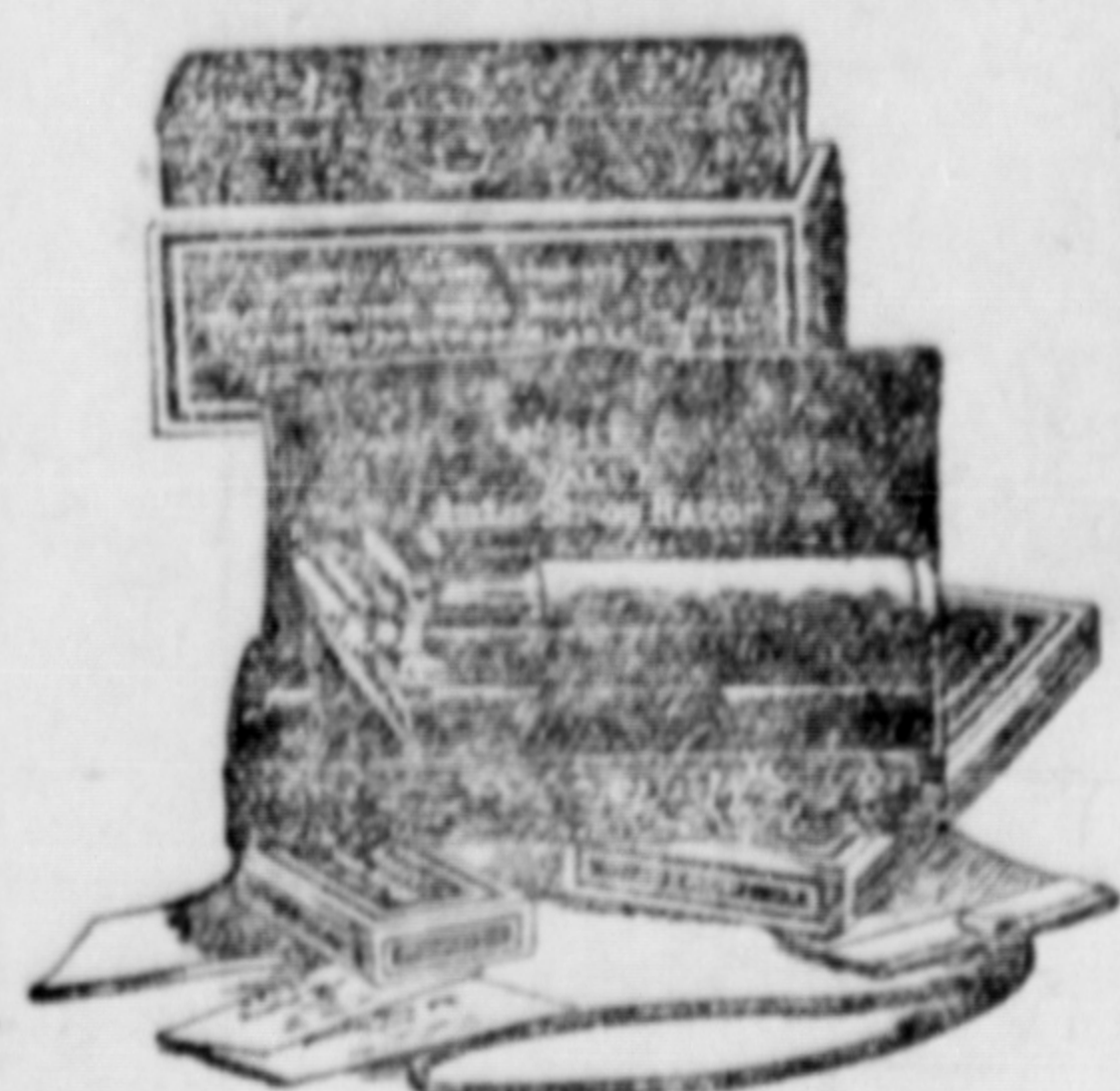

SEALED TENDERS, endorsed "Tender for Stewart-Hydro Road," will be received by the Honorable the Minister of Public Works up to Noon of Thursday, the 31st day of May, 1923, for the construction of approximately 1.02 miles of the Stewart-Hydro Road.

Plans, specifications, contract, and forms of Tender may be seen on and after the 14th day of May, 1923, at Department of Public Works, Victoria; Public Works Office, Court House, Vancouver; District Engineers Office, Prince Rupert; Asst. District Engineers Office, Stewart.

Copies of plans, specifications, etc., can be obtained from the Department on payment of a deposit of \$10.00 which will be refunded on return of the plans, etc., in good condition.

Each tender must be accompanied by an accepted bank cheque on a chartered bank of Canada, made payable to the Honorable the Minister of Public Works, for the sum of \$2,500 which shall be forfeited if the party tendering declines to enter into contract when called upon to do so. The cheque of the successful tenderer will be retained as security for the due and faithful performance of the work till the satisfactory completion of the contract.

Tenders will not be considered unless made out on the forms supplied, signed with the actual signature of the tenderer, and enclosed in the envelopes furnished.
