

LONDON, July 3 .- The big city of Frankfurt on the Mayence River is now entirely surrounded by territory occupied by the French in connection with the occupation of the Ruhr Valley. French military moves have now completely cut it off from the rest of Germany to the north. The French have occupied Schwerte and other troops are on the way to Hagen.
