BRINGING UP FATHER

ALICE ARM WON HOCKEY MATCH

Got Revenge Over Anyox Last Sunday by Score of 9 to 2

ALICE ARM, Feb. 7.—Revenge, spelled with a great big "R" was what the Alice Arm Bears took out upon the Smoke Eaters of Anyox mine in a hockey game at the Arena Sunday, when they won by a score of 9 to 2. Smarting under a three to nothing defeat inflicted upon them by the Anyox bunch in the first game of the season, the Bears went at it hammer and tongs and never let up. The game was featured by hard playing and heavy checking of many varieties.

Alice Arm showed great improvement over the first game of the series both in aggressiveness and stick handling. This can be attributed to the local games of the inter-camp series, which is made possible by Alice Arm possessing a covered rink.

After the first period Anyox Mine showed a lag in their play, and there was evidence of "that tired feeling." Again and again the rushes of the Smoke Eaters broke down on the Alice Arm defense. The play was mostly carried to the Anyox end of the ice, and Ross' job at goal was a sinecure, if that means an easy job with very little to do. While nine counters got by the Anyox goalie, yet he played a good game. Many more than nine were turned safely away. To Anderson, of the Smoke Eaters, were credited the two goals carried back to the Mine Hill.

Of the nine goals garnered in by the Alice Arm Bears, four were made by A. Falconer, four by Oatman and one by G. S. Anderson.

World's championships in the National League have been held as follows: New York, 3; Chicago, 2; Boston, 1; Pittsburgh, 1; and Cincinnati, 1.

Only two cities, Chicago and Boston, have retained their franchises in the National League since its inception. In addition to the eight cities now represented in the National League, the following cities have held membership in the circuit (the length of their membership also is included): Cleveland 17 years; Washington, 12 years; Louisville, 9 years; Baltimore, Detroit and Providence, 8 years each; Buffalo 7 years; Indianapolis and Troy, 4 years each; Worcester, Syracuse, Milwaukee and Kansas City, one year each.
