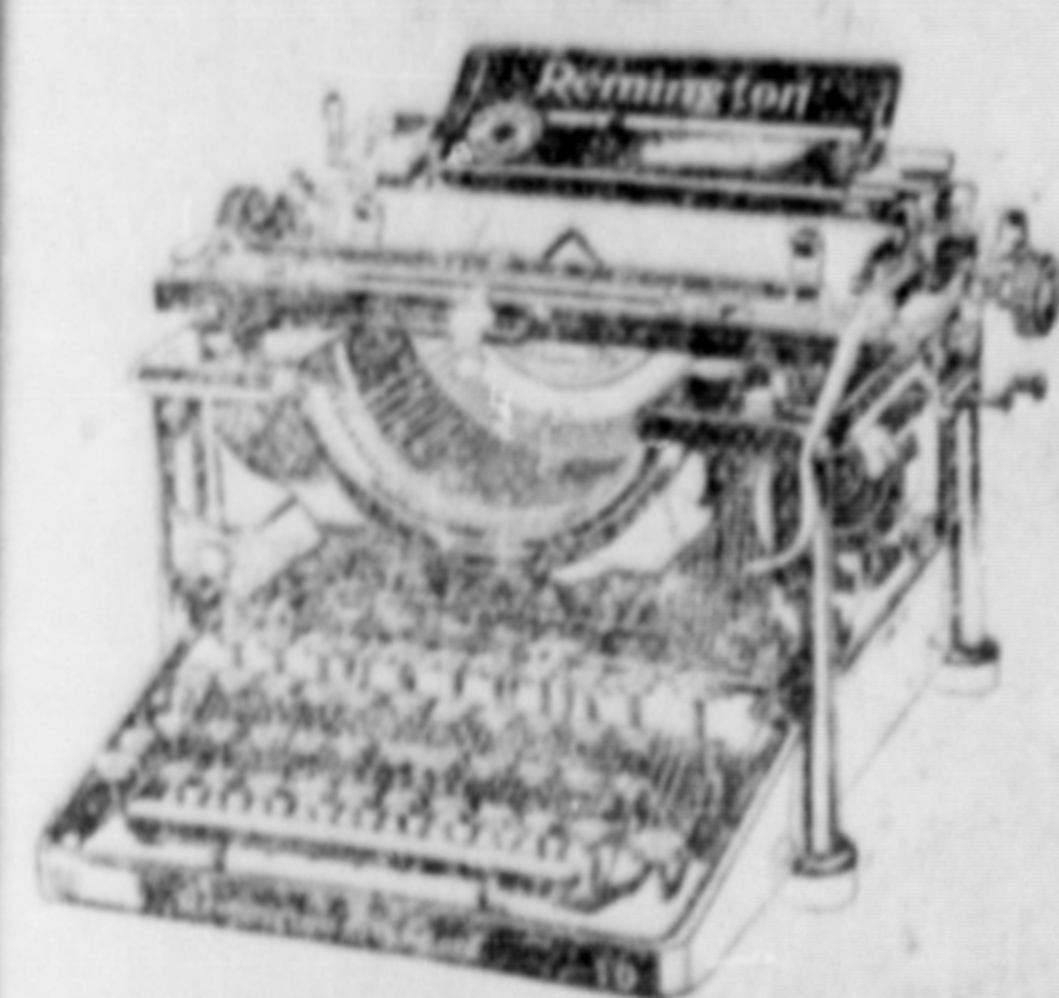

THORNTON'S REPLY TO MAYOR NEWTON

Says Pressure of Eastern Engagements Makes Prince Rupert Visit Impossible at this Time

In reply to the telegram sent to Sir Henry Thornton pressing upon him the invitation to visit Prince Rupert on his present tour of the West, Mayor Newton received the following message:

"Your message received and I much regret that, owing to important engagements at Ottawa in the week commencing January 28, I am obliged to return East direct from Vancouver. My reason for the present time was to see as quickly as possible as much of our property and to meet as many citizens as I could but I find it impossible to do all this at once in view of the extensive territory to be covered. It is only pressure of time that prevents me going over the northern line on the present tour and I assure you that I am looking forward to seeing you and meeting yourself and the citizens of Prince Rupert at the earliest possible opportunity."

BUSINESS DEPRESSION IS AFFECTING JAPAN

General Trend in That Country is Toward Improvement

TOKIO, Jan. 22.—Business and finance are still suffering depression in Japan, although there has been a noticeable upturn in the general trend since November. The fight for lower bank rate on credit is being carried on actively by business interests and the fact that the move is winning political support as well as the endorsement of the most influential commercial business houses in the country is taken as an indication that something will be done.

Advocates of a reduction in bank rates argue that business is handicapped by lack of capital; that ruling high rates drain the resources of private enterprise, transferring cost of capital to the consumer and thus increasing the cost of living.

The government is expected to release considerable capital within the next five weeks in the form of maturing issues, and the fact that the influx of gold has been stopped for sometime is a sign that the credit situation is improving.

Markets for coal, rubber, edible and drying oils, secondary metals, including tin, lead and zinc and petroleum are growing stronger, but against them are many products that have slumped, such as heavy chemicals, dyes, paints, lumber, iron, steel, fertilizer. Steel registered a series of declines and the outlook is anything but bright.

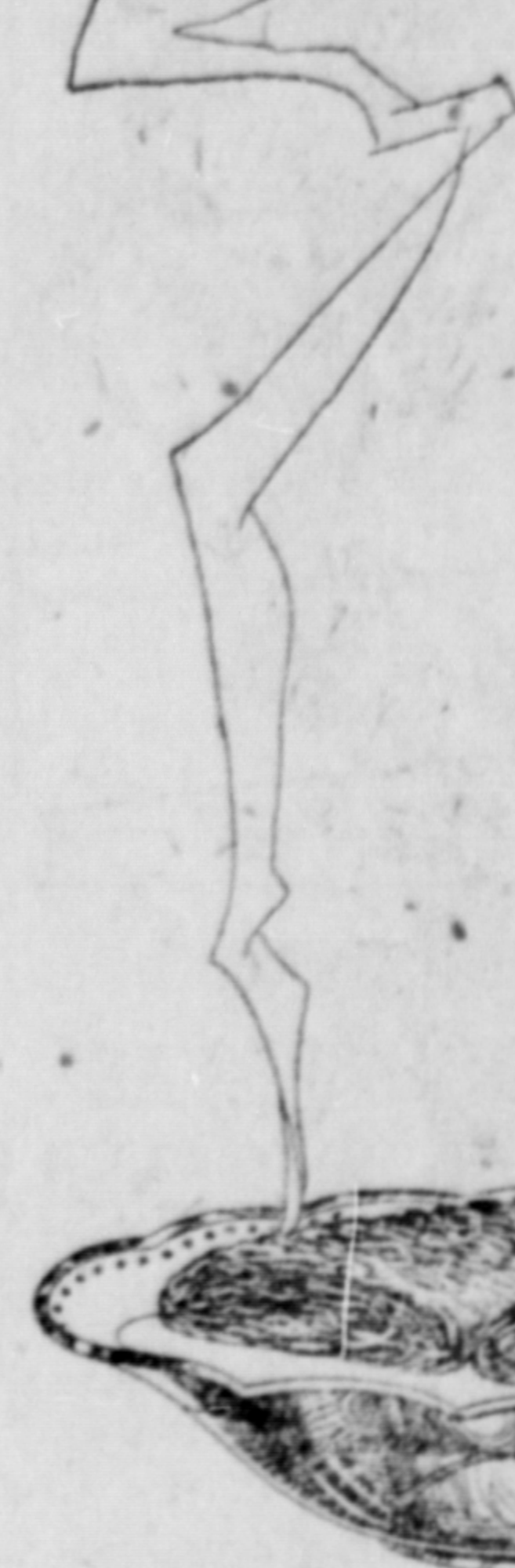
The Yokohama raw silk market has registered important advances recently. The rice and wheat markets are dull.
