There is a good trail on which are located comfortable road houses. Whitehorse, the centre of supply for the new district, will be a busy place this winter.

At the meeting of the Hospital Board last night it was decided to keep up membership in the Hospital Association, the annual dues for which are \$20.

Delayed on account of heavy freights and also because of stormy weather, C.P.R. steamer Princess Mary, Capt. Arthur Slater, from Alaska, is not expected before tomorrow morning.

In reply to a letter received from Fire Chief Macdonald, by the hospital board at its meeting last evening, T. Ross Mackay said full provision was being made for fire escapes in the new nurses' home.

Hospital Association membership cards have been sent to all those who subscribed five dollars or more in the Nurses' Home drive, the secretary reported at the meeting of the hospital directors last night.

In regard to a sewer difficulty at the hospital, the chairman, D. G. Stewart, informed the Board last night that he had ordered the matter attended to and the bill for \$18.75 was presented for the work. As there are a number of houses using this sewer, it was decided to ask the city to pay it and the matter was left with the proper committee to deal with.

The report of the building committee of the Nurses' Home to the directors last night showed that the work was well advanced and up to the present extras had amounted to only \$27. The building was a credit to the community and if at any time not needed for the purpose for which it was designed it would make a good residence or boarding house.

After a short discussion the hospital board last evening decided not to purchase three lots adjoining the Nurses' Home offered them through Thomas McClymont. The reason for refusal was that the hospital had no funds for the purpose, but the opinions expressed indicated that it was not considered that the hospital needed them. S. K. Campbell said if they ever built a new hospital it would probably go on some other site, and the present site would then be sold.
