

### WORK FOR WORKLESS

Unemployed Are Under Military Rule at Halifax

(Canadian Press.) HALIFAX, Dec. 14:- Nearly 300 single men, unemployed last summer, are hard at work restoring the Citadel fortress to its former proportions.

Abandoned by troops last year for the first time since the city was founded in 1749, the fortress is to be preserved as a historic site. The work is being done at the direction of the federal government, as part of an unemployment relief pro

The workmen live in the quarters formerly occupied by troops. They are under military discipline and are beginning to like it. They will have work, food and shelter at the Citadel until March 31, when they will be discharged. In addition they will receive 20 cents a day.
