> Canada imports a considerable amount of artificial silk, yarns and thread, and goods manufactured from artificial silk. For the fiscal year ended March 31, last, Canada's imports of artificial silk, yarns and thread, totalled nearly 1,000,000 pounds, having a value of \$2,248,997. In the previous year the imports had amounted to 570,000 pounds. having a value of \$1,347,871. The largest amount of the imports came from the United Kingdom in 1923, and from that country we imported artificial silk, yarn and thread to the amount of 470,000 pounds, havalso imported smaller quantitie from the United States, from Belgium, from France, from Nether lands, from Switzerland, and from some other countries.

Tariff on Artificial Silk

Recognition of the importance f our imports of artificial silk has come in the tariff rulings from Ottawa, and one of Mr Fielding's budgets provided that the general tariff on artificial silk yarns produced from a form of cellulose should be 15 per cent and the British preferential tariff 10 per cent. On fabrics made of artificial silk the duty would vary from 30 per cent and 17 1/2 per cent to 37 1/2 per cent and 30 per cent.
