

Morley Shier arrived this afternoon on the Venture from Surf Inlet and will be in the city for a few days.

The Prince John has arrived in port with a cargo of the famous Ladysmith-Wellington EGG COAL for the Prince Rupert Coal Co., which they are quoting at \$13.50 a ton delivered. 113

**CIVIC EMPLOYEES CONSIDER STRIKE**

Power to Act on Matter Left With Executive Committee—New Officers Are Elected

The Civic Employees' Union, at its regular monthly meeting last night, considered the action of the city council in rejecting the finding of the Board of Conciliation on the wage dispute and voted on the matter of a strike, leaving the power in the hands of a committee of three from the executive of the Union to call a strike if, in their judgment, the situation warrants it at any time. Action now is being deferred until next Monday night's council meeting at which time the situation as affecting the employees will be dealt with again. The strike committee consists of J. A. McRae, George Letts and Fred Clarke.

J. A. McRae was elected president of the Union in place of George B. Casey who has resigned, and George Letts was elected vice-president, succeeding D. S. Cameron, also resigned.
