A letter from H. C. Fraser expressing appreciation of the excellent service given in the Prince Rupert General Hospital which he said was not excelled anywhere else was reported to the hospital board last night by D. G. McRae, chairman of the finance committee.

The regular monthly meeting of the hospital board was held last evening in the city council chamber. Those present were President D. G. Stewart, D. G. McRae, Mrs. S. Darton, Mrs. Jarvis McLeod, S. K. Campbell, T. Ross Mackay and Major Geo. E. Gibson, secretary.

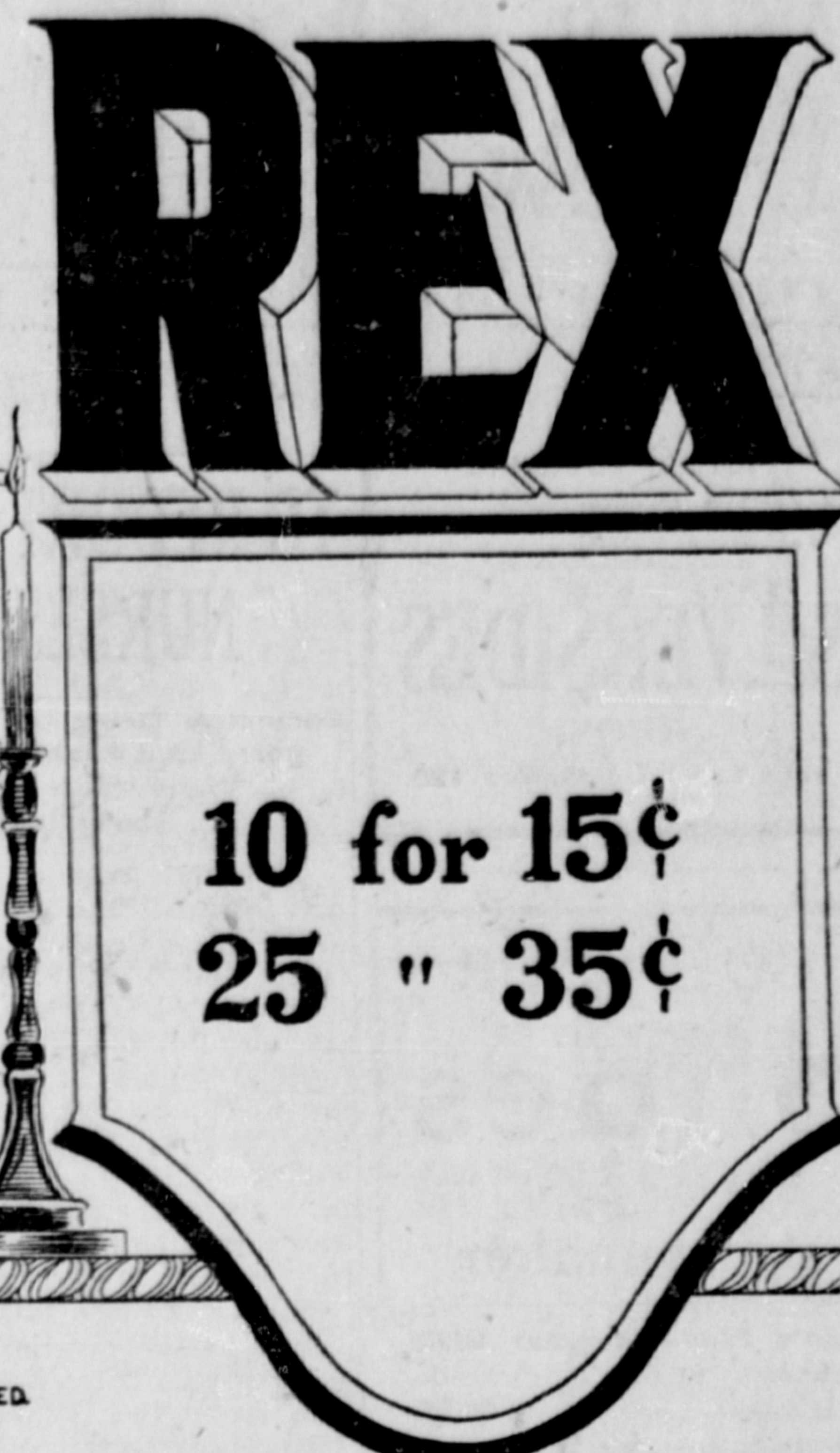
