**P.G.E. AUDIT FOLLOWS UPON CHARGES MADE**

Hon. John Oliver Explains Situation to Legislature Following Report

VICTORIA, Nov. 5.—The relationship of the Northern Construction Company to the P.G.E. and the financial transactions between the two are to be thoroughly investigated by an independent auditor, according to an announcement made by Hon. John Oliver in the legislature last week. The announcement follows charges made by General McRae and others and suggested by opposition members of the Legislature. The audit is to be a thorough one and will clear up in the minds of the people any doubts they may have had as to the integrity of the Premier in this respect. In his address on the subject to the Legislature Mr. Oliver said:

"It is not my intention to speak at length on this matter—it has been threshed over and over. The government, and myself in particular, have been accused either directly or inferentially, with almost everything from petty larceny to aiding and abetting the Northern Construction Company of robbing the province of millions of dollars. Some members of this House have made wild statements, but others outside the House have arisen, and these latter have called to their aid a former accounting auditor of the railway company, who has apparently sworn to the truth of certain statements and who has produced certain letters or copies of letters in support of the statements made.

**Promised an Enquiry**

"Now, what are the facts? E. J. Rossiter was employed as auditor and accountant by the Pacific Great Eastern Railway Company. It was his duty to examine and certify to the correctness of all the accounts of the Northern Construction Company as contractors doing work for the railway company. During the performance of his duties he found certain accounts which he did not consider properly charged or sufficiently vouched for, and so he reported first the chief engineer and afterwards myself. The report to myself was marked confidential, but as (with the exception of one paragraph, which has to do with Rossiter's side line as a money lender), the letter was dealing with the duties of Rossiter's office, I refused to consider such letter as confidential, and so advised the writer. I also advised him that I would have an enquiry made."

**QUEEN CHARLOTTES**
