Committee Refers New Measure to House of Representatives For Consideration

WASHINGTON, D.C., Dec. 16:--The ways and means committee yesterday passed upon a beer bill for the consideration of the House of Representatives. The measure was due to be introduced today but will probably not be morrow or, possibly, next week.

The proposed bill provides a federal tax of \$5 per barrel on beer and leaves the means of sale to individual states.
