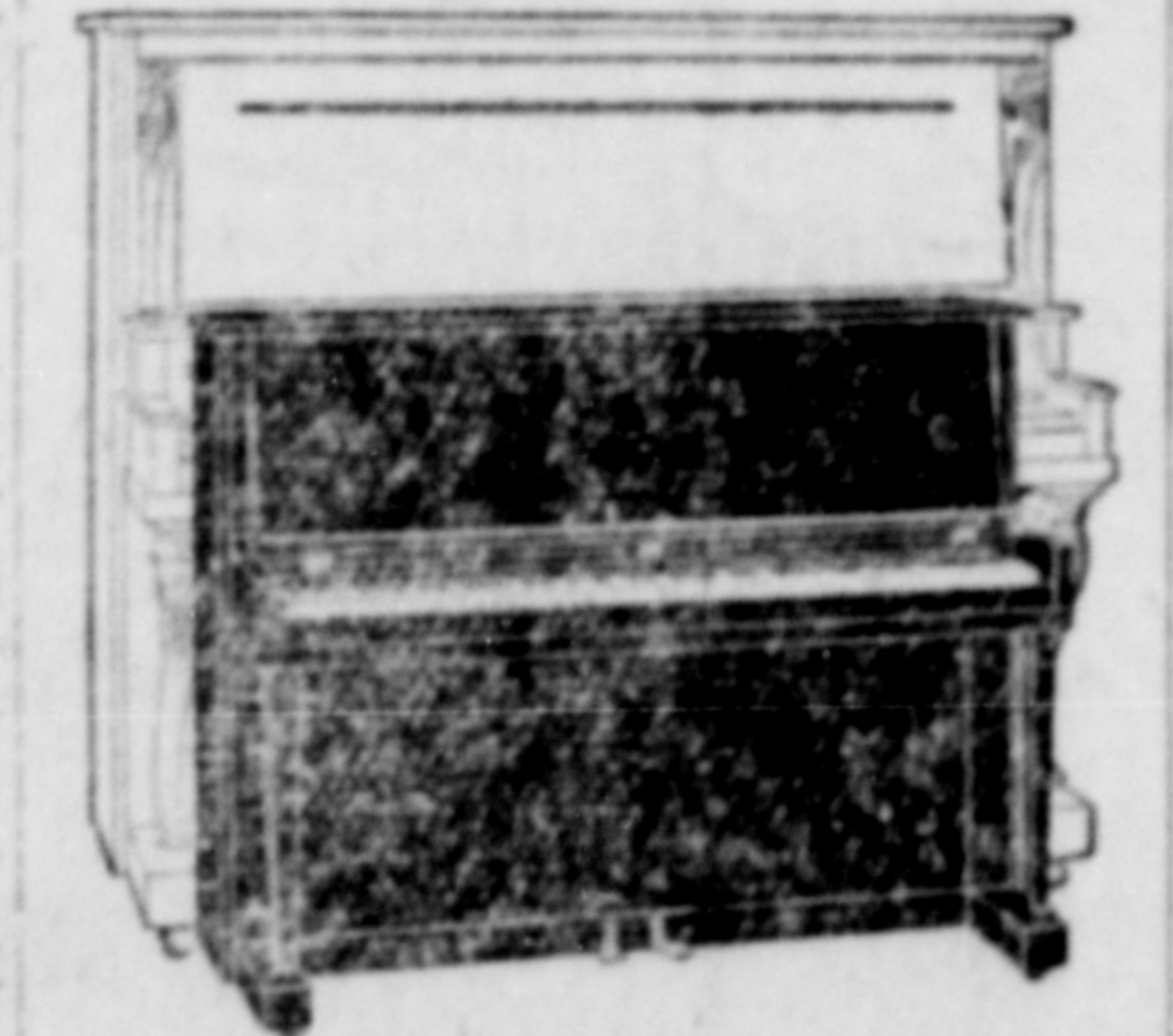
Sport Chat

Boxing fans have been asking lately about measurements of Jack Dempsey and Tom Gibbons who will fight at Shelby on July 1 for the world's heavyweight crown. These have come to hand and show when the two men enter the ring they will look like twins in height and weight. Dempsey has more weight in his shoulders than Gibbons but the latter's poundage is more evenly distributed. In height the champion has a slight margin for he is 6 ft. 1 in. tall and Gibbons is 6 ft. 3 in. Dempsey weighs 188 pounds and Gibbons 185 pounds in fighting condition.

Other measurements are as follows:

Neck—Dempsey, 16½; Gibbons, 17.
Chest—Dempsey, 42 and 45; Gibbons, 40 and 44.
Waist—Dempsey, 33; Gibbons, 34.
Biceps—Dempsey, 18½; Gibbons, 14½.
Forearm—Dempsey, 14½; Gibbons, 13.
Wrist—Dempsey, 9; Gibbons, 9.
Thigh—Dempsey, 23; Gibbons, 22.
Calf—Dempsey, 15½; Gibbons, 15½.
Ankle—Dempsey, 9; Gibbons, 9.
Reach—Dempsey, 74; Gibbons, 74.

Dempsey is 28 years old and Gibbons 32. Dempsey started boxing in 1915 and Gibbons two years before that. Dempsey has had 60 battles and Gibbons, 88. Gibbons has never been knocked out or knocked down. Dempsey was knocked out once by Jim Flynn in one round and has been off his feet a dozen times. Gibbons has lost but one decision in his life—that to Harry Greb. His loss to Billy Miske on a foul does not count for he was given the popular decision. Gibbons has knocked out 37 opponents and Dempsey, 30. Gibbons was born in St. Paul, Minn., and Dempsey in Manassa, Colorado.
