W. A. Found, assistant deputy minister of fisheries, Ottawa, and Major J. A. Motherwell, chief inspector of fisheries, Vancouver, passed through this morning on the fisheries protection steamer Givenchy bound for Vancouver after visiting the Naas River.

Carl Gustavsen, who was sentenced yesterday afternoon by Judge Young to serve nine months at Okalla prison for having stolen goods in his possession, was taken south on the Gardena last evening by Special Constable George Crate. Before being sentenced yesterday, Gustavsen told Judge Young that he had been in Canada for six years, having beat his way across from Shelby, Montana, without going before immigration officials.
