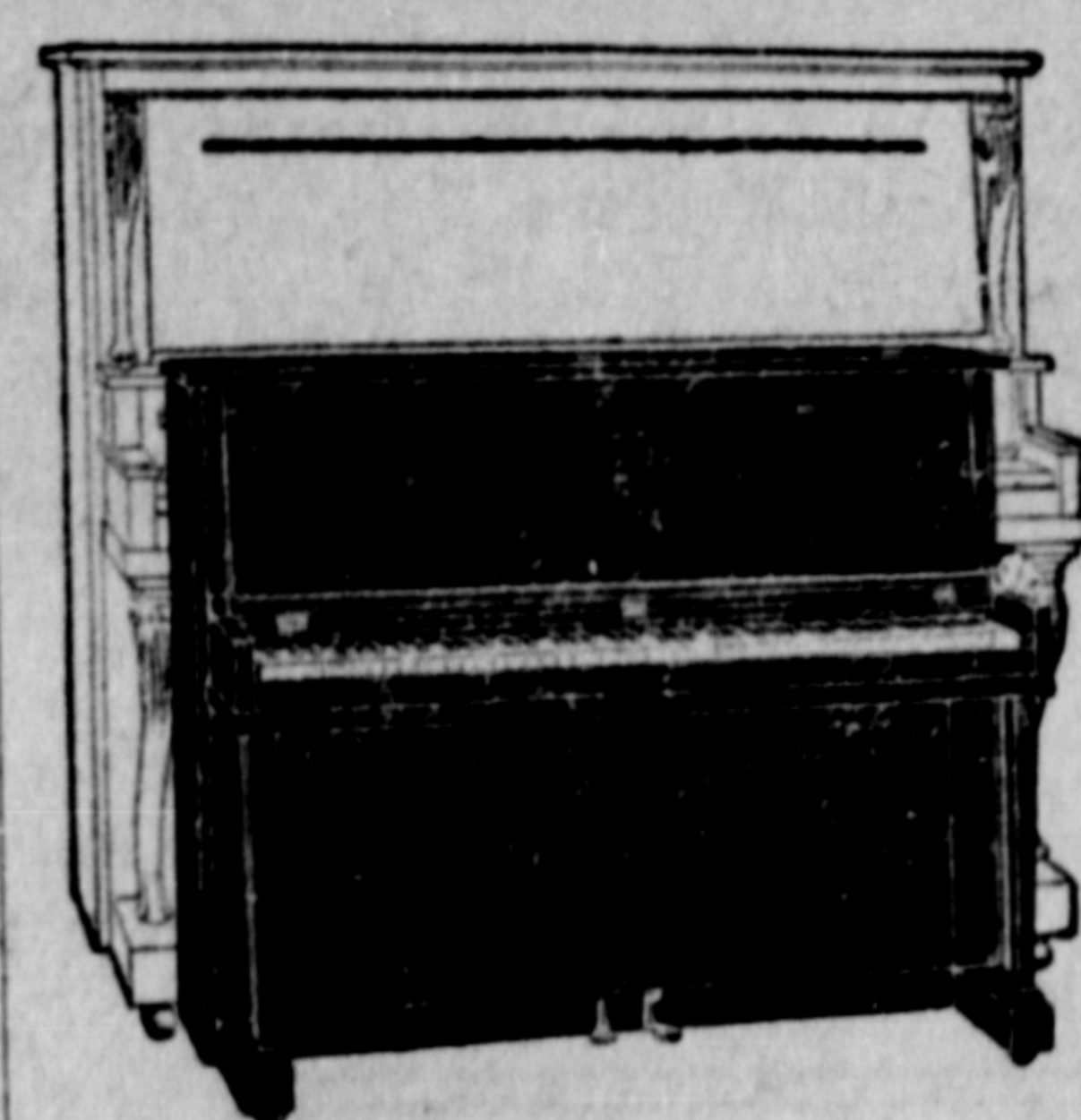

KANATAK IS LATEST ADDITION TO FLEET

Brand New American Schooner, Owned and Skippered by Pete Wold, is in Port Today

The brand new Seattle halibut schooner Kanatak, a fine looking craft, is in port today with 30,000 pounds of halibut after her first voyage to the fishing banks. She sold to the Canadian Fish & Gold Storage Co. at 18.4c and 10c.

The Kanatak, which is owned and skippered by Pete Wold, formerly of the Atlas, is 65 feet long and is powered with a full-deisel 65 horse-power motor. She carries a crew of seven men and has a capacity of 60,000 pounds of halibut.

BOOTLEG JOINTS ARE FOUND IN BERLIN

Take Place of all Night Cafes Which are Being Repressed: Banker's Place Used

BERLIN, Oct. 24.—Since reformers started out recently to put an end to the all night cafe life in Berlin, ingenious bootleggers have conceived all sorts of schemes to outwit the police. Despite the regulations, all-night cafes have been exceedingly popular here, and bring in handsome profits for their managers. Clandestine cabarets and drinking places have been springing up like mushrooms, chiefly for the benefit of profiteers and their friends who usually do not feel like going to their homes when ousted by the police at midnight.

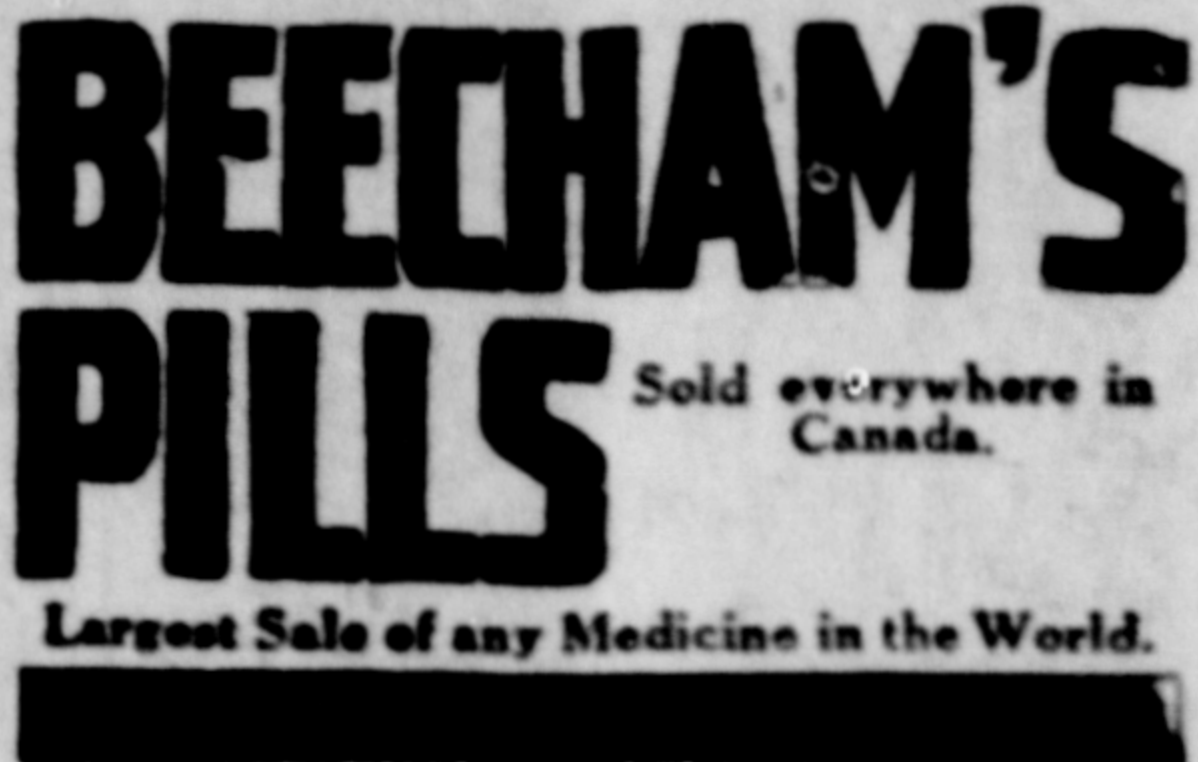

CHURCH PAYS FINE TO KING OF ENGLAND

Was Imposed During Reign of Henry VIII. For Allowing Pilgrims to Come

LONDON, Oct. 24.—The record for a long distance fine appears to belong to the office of vicar of the Church of Our Lady of Willesden, which ancient edifice stands in one of London's suburbs, for that personage is required to pay an annual contribution of one pound, two shillings and a sixpence to the king, and he has been paying it for almost 400 years.

This fine was imposed after the Reformation by Henry VIII. on the medieval vicar because he allowed pilgrims to come to his church and bathe their eyes in the water of a well which is supposed to contain curative properties. The pilgrims in gratitude often left sums of money, which aroused Henry's ire, and the vicar escaped the stake only by handing all the money thus collected over to Henry, and agreeing to pay an annual fine, and vesting his sins on his successors.

Although Henry instituted many such gentle methods of increasing the kingly exchequer, this is the only instance of the fine still being paid.

The well on the church property still attracts many pilgrims who come to bathe their eyes with the miraculous waters, many of whom claim to have been cured thereby.

GERMANS STAND AS MARSEILLAISE IS PLAYED BY BAND

ZURICH, Switzerland, Oct. 24.—There was a tense moment during the congress in this city of the International Cycling Union—when German and Austrian delegates met the French representatives—but it came out all right. For the Germans arose and stood at attention while a band played the "Marseillaise," the national anthem of France.

CHINESE ARE TRADING UNDER BRITISH NAMES

Henderson Brown Company Turns Out to be Der Hong

VICTORIA, Oct. 23.—A certain feeling of mild surprise was observable in the demeanor of Magistrate Jay, when, in response to the charge called against the Henderson-Brown Company, of failing to carry a rear light on its motor car, Der Hong came forward and said he desired to plead guilty to the offence.

"What, are you the Henderson-Brown Company?" asked the court.

Through the mediation of Wing, the court interpreter, Der Hong wished it to be understood that he was the Henderson-Brown Company, and that the Henderson-Brown Company was an association of Chinese farmers in the Gordon Head district.

"It is becoming more and more the custom for these men to do business under English names," explained City Prosecutor Harrison; while R. C. Lowe, intervening in the capacity of amicus curiae, pointed out that another Chinaman in the city was doing business under the name and in the style of Sunshine & Company.

"Me Henderson-Brown, me pay," volunteered Der Hong; and the court decreed that the Henderson-Brown corporation should pay a fine of \$5.
