### PEOPLE TO VOTE ON CONVEYANCE OF LOT TO WAR VETERANS

Advised by the city solicitor that original conveyance of the lot on Third Avenue two years ago to the Great War Veterans' Association was not in order because of faulty description and also for the reason that the Association did not hold title to the lot which it sought to exchange, the city council last

night ordered the putting to the people at the next election of another by-law authorizing the conveyance and exempting the property from taxation. The matter came up in connection with Ald. Collar's notice of motion calling for taxation exemption.
