THUNDERCLAP AT WEEK END

Famous Race Track Scene and Thrilling Stunts Make This Big Film

Scenes of Derby days at prominent race tracks are vividly recalled in "Thunderclap," which is to be shown here Friday and Saturday, the piece de resistance of many thrills and pleasing situations being one of the most exciting horse races yet seen either on the track or on the silver screen.

For the nonce, the atmosphere of the motion picture fades into a typical Empire or Lantonia scene in which one finds himself again good naturedly jostled by the vast throng and struggling for a point of vantage as the entries parade before the admiring thousands.

Again there is the suspense as the riders jockey for advantage at the wire, the snarl of the barrier, the shout, "They're off," the clatter of steel-shod hoofs, the subdued eagerness while the pageant fairly flies down the back stretch, the turn into the final eighth, the closing spurt, the flash beneath the wire and the shouts for the victor.

All is Genuine
It is all so real, so genuine and so thoroughly thrilling that this feature alone is sufficient for the entertainment of those who witness "Thunderclap." There are many other thrills in the life of the little convent girl who finds such a different world when cast among gamblers.

Perhaps most memorable of all, next to the remarkable race scene, is that of the hero swirling down the rapids. One paper says that it made all other similar scenes ever filmed look very tame. In the taking of this incident, Paul Willis, the hero, almost lost his life. He did not have to call on his histrionic assets to register fear, his fear was genuine; and the colored lad who plays in the picture insists that Willis carried a horse shoe in his pocket while he careered down the torrent to what looked like sure death.

Clean Sportsmanship
At the end of the story clean sportsmanship triumphs over crooked gambling; and a mother, a girl and a boy win happiness.

GRIPPING DRAMA IS KINDRED OF DUST

Gripping drama, produced by a masterhand and enacted by a cast the strength of which could not have been improved upon, collectively or individually, that is "Kindred of the Dust," from the famous novel by Peter B. Kyne, whose readers are numbered in the hundreds of thousands.

The suspense which is quickly developed at the start of the tale is carried without diminution throughout the six reels, and the gathering momentum results in a climax which literally brings one out of his seat.

Especially noteworthy are the spectacular incidents of the story, such as a rescue on the log jam. The imminent danger of the two actors who imperil their lives before the camera is so apparent that the spectator leans forward with bated breath, fearful that

one or both will slip through the legs and be drowned.

Throughout the tale there is a thread of romance which has a particular appeal of its own, with Miriam Cooper as "Nan of the Sawdust Pile," and Ralph Graves as Donald McKay, playing the part of the lovers.

TORONTO SPEAKER ON SOCIAL EVIL
