ASSEMBLY OF PRESBYTERIANS

Dr. Alfred Gandler Likely to be
Moderator—Report Standing
and Progress

PORT ARTHUR, Ont., June 1—(By Canadian Press.)—On Wednesday evening, June 6, when the Presbyterian general assembly opens in St. Paul's Church in this city one of the first steps to be taken after the preaching of the annual sermon by Rev. Dr. W. J. Clark, of Montreal will be the election of a moderator to preside at all the meetings here and to serve in that capacity through the ensuing year.

For this post, the highest honor in the gift of the church, it is conceded that Rev. Dr. Alfred Gandler, at one time the minister of St. James Square Presbyterian church, Toronto, and more recently for many years the principal of Knox College, Toronto, will be elected. As the head of Knox College, the most important of the educational institutions of the Presbyterian church, Dr. Gandler is known throughout the church. He is an excellent speaker, a thorough scholar and a man of great personal influence in Toronto and throughout the province of Ontario. He will be of great service both through the meetings of the assembly, and in the general work of the church through the following year.

which will come up this year will be the election of a permanent clerk of the assembly. This was a position held for about 36 years by the late Rev. Dr. Robert Campbell, of Montreal. On the death of Dr. Campbell in 1921, the position was taken by the Rev. Thomas Stewart of Halifax. Dr. Stewart has since died, and the work of the clerk is being done temporarily by the Rev. B. B. Cochrane, minister of the College Street church in Toronto. This is one of the largest churches in the denomination and it is improbable that Mr. Cochrane will continue to discharge the duties of the clerk's office. The assembly will therefore have to appoint a new official for this position.

The commissioners to the general assembly this year will hear from the treasurer of the denomination a statement of a large deficit in the funds for the schemes of the church. This deficit is much the largest that the church has ever had, amounting at the present time to about \$800,000.

Church Deficit

In explanation of this deficit it may be said that it is not really as large as it appears. The church always has a deficit at this time of the year in its benevolent funds due to the fact that the expenditures are practically the same every month whereas the most of the churches send in their gifts at the close of the year. It may also be pointed out that the deficit is not peculiar to the Presbyterian church. It is true of all churches due to the fact that the churches in the war period and just after the war enlarged their work, especially the mission work in foreign lands. In addition the work in foreign lands costs more now, since the rise in prices has affected foreign countries just as it has affected the home land. Then there has been the burden of exchange, which accounts for about \$100,000 of the deficit. The contributions of the churches have not fallen off but have been well maintained. The real deficit at the beginning of the year was about \$350,000, the debt on home mission account being about \$100,000 and the debt on foreign mission account being about \$250,000. The work this year will be reduced and the receipts may be increased to the same extent, with the probability that a deficit of some size will have to be carried into 1924.

Church Union

What the commissioners will talk about for the nine or ten days of their stay here is indicated by the agenda which is much the same for the assembly each year. This year the great subject of discussion will of course be church union and the developments in this connection are uncertain. Probably a couple of days will be spent in hearing speeches on the subject. In addition to the subject of church union the commissioners will hear reports from all its various agencies, boards, committees, etc. It will hear from the home mission board with reference to church work in the newer districts of Canada, from the foreign mission committee having charge of the work at the church in India, China, Korea, the New Hebrides, Trinidad, etc., from the eight theological colleges, from its committee on the aged and infirm ministers funds, and the widows and orphans fund, from its board of publication, and many other agencies.

Standing and Progress

Each year there are submitted to the assembly statistics showing the standing and progress of the church. Without going into the figures too minutely it may be stated that this year the statistics will show that the church in Canada holds property to the

amount of \$30,000,000. It raised in 1922 for all its purposes, benevolent and congregational, between nine and ten million dollars, of which nearly one third was for benevolent purposes. The total number of ministers on the rolls of the presbyteries is about 1,700 and the total number of elders is about 12,000. The present membership of the church stands at 369,939, a gain in the year of 12,728 over the previous year. By profession of faith 17,956 persons joined the church during the year and 1,742 certificates, 16,983. The number of families in the church is 201,737, an increase in the year of 5,089. Single persons identified with the church number 45,572, an increase of 2,590. In the Sunday schools there are 290,413 scholars, an increase of 14,844. Of teachers there are reported 31,172, a gain of 1,073.

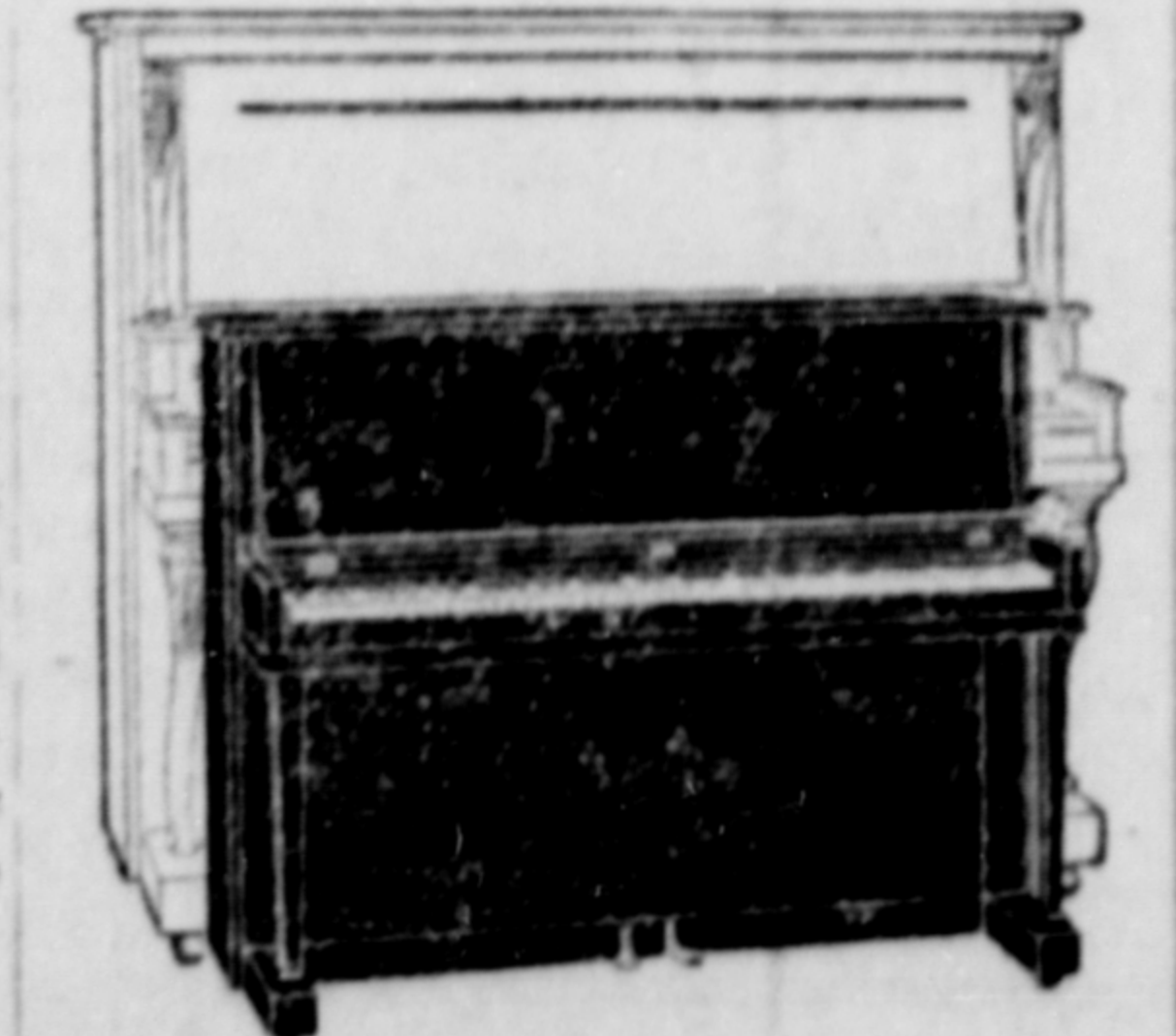
