

Local Member And Local Activities.

Hon. T. D. Pattullo, member for this district, is to be complimented on his activity in connection with the transfer of lands from the Railway Company to the province preparatory to the building of the road to the Skeena River. What is needed now is activity on the road out of Prince Rupert and it is understood this will receive attention just as soon as the preparatory arrangements are complete. We cannot ask more.

Steel Company Propaganda.

. There has been a lot of propaganda throughout the province on behalf of the Coast Range Steel Company and a delegation waited on Premier Oliver last week asking that Legislation be passed enabling the government to aid a steel company.

Premier Oliver refused to commit the government, saying that no definite assurances had been received from anyone. The offer of the trade facilities committee of Great Britain had been conditional on help coming from the Dominion government and no such aid had been promised. Also there was no definite assurance from Old Country interests. There must be a clear cut proposal before the Provincial government would act because they had to safeguard the interests of the people of the province.

It is to be hoped that the premier sticks to this attitude until the company is able to show that it is something more than a promotion concern. There have been too many companies of that kind in British Columbia.

Foreign Policy Of Great Britain.

While the policy of protection was the principal one only which the British elections were fought, the change in the political aspect of the British House of Commons will have an important bearing on the foreign policy of that country. It will insure that no large sums of money be spent outside the country in connection with naval bases and that the army and navy expenditures will be kept down to a minimum. Singapore will he abandoned as the naval base for the Pacific and other works or proposed works outside the United Kingdom will recrive little encouragement. Even the iron and steel project for British Columbia, which it was suggested under certain conditions might be helped, will in all probability be dropped. 




