SEQUEL TO ROBIN HOOD TO BE SHOWN

Week End Offering Here is Richard the Lion-Hearted Based on the Talsman

Starting out at that point of the story of "Robin Hood" as portrayed by Douglas Fairbanks where the Earl of Huntingdon leaves to crusade and returns to England, the first Associated Authors production "Richard the Lion-Hearted" deals with the adventures of this celebrated English King and his attempts to wrest the control of the holy sepulchre from the Saracens lead by Saladin. Sir Walter Scott's well-known novel "The Talsman" furnishes the basis for the story.

It is a colorful, highly interesting and finely mounted production that promises well for the new Associated Authors' organization. Being so closely connected with the story of "Robin Hood," in fact quite a few scenes taken from that picture introducing Douglas Fairbanks have been incorporated in the film—it is natural that these two pictures will be compared in the spectator's mind. This, in a way, is unfortunate, for "Richard the Lion-Hearted" makes no pretense of being such a stupendous production, neither has it the "snap" and speed of that film. But at the same time it is a picture that should appeal to almost any type of audience on its own merits. Also, it should, because of the great interest aroused in the character of "Richard the Lion-Hearted" on account of the fine performance of Wallace Beery, appeal particularly to all who saw "Robin Hood," for in the new film Beery continues his portrayal of that lovable monarch.

FEW MOVIE PLOTS SOLD BY AMATEURS

NEW YORK, Dec. 18.—Of the 42,020 plots and stories submitted to motion picture producers last year by amateur writers, 42,016 were returned as "unavailable."

The article declares that film producers do not want unknown writers to submit scenarios, and that they don't, as a rule, read much manuscripts.
