Although many thousands of persons prize the miniature, black judite totem poles of the Haida Indians, Tew realize that no other country is in possession of the material from which they are made, and it is not generally known that the unique earving duplicates the totem poles of ancient days, when thousands of Indians placed their crests and legends on the large cedar trees to show their clanship, and the insignia of the chiefs of the various tribes of a then primitive race of human beings.
