

## Promotion Lists of All Pupils in Public Schools Placed in Grades under the New System

Beginning in September next the Department of Education has decided to adopt the eight grade system in the public schools of the province. The present grading is based on the seven year system by readers. In future a child beginning school will enter Grade One and at the conclusion of the first year in school will pass into Grade Two, etc. The eighth year in school or eighth grade will commonly be called the entrance year or class. In this year's grading the extra class necessitated by the change, from the seven year system to the eight year system, was placed between the present fourth reader and junior fifth. That is to say David Westaway, Enid Williams, that the pupils standing highest Jack Wrathall, Mildred Lindsay in the fourth reader were promoted to Grade 6; those not standing quite so high were placed in Grade 5; while those whose work was unsatisfactory were required to repeat Grade 4, or present fourth reader.

## Canada Confident of the Future



ANADA is endeavoring to regain her after-the-war stride in the midst of many difficulties, — debt, deflation and depression being some of them.

The United Empire Loyalists subdued an unbroken forest in one generation, growing their first wheat amid the stumps and snags of the new clearing.

The Selkirk settlers came to Manitoba when the prairie was a buffalo pasture, and grew wheat where none had grown before and where those who knew the country best at that time said wheat never would grow. To-day the Canadian prairies grow the finest wheat in the world.

In proportion to population Canada stands to-day among the wealthiest nations in the world, with average savings on deposit per family of \$800. Canada's foreign trade per head of population stands amongst the highest of the commercial nations, being \$192 per capita in 1922-23, as compared with \$135 in 1913-14, the "peak" year before the war.

#### New Opportunities for Canada

In Canada, although prices in the world markets fell below war level, our farmers reaped last autumn the largest grain crop in Canadian history, and Canada became the world's largest exporter of wheat, thus in large measure making up for lower prices.

Last year, Great Britain, after an agitation extending over thirty years removed the embargo on Canadian cattle, and a profitable and practically unlimited trade is opening up for Canadian stockers and feeders.

"The 20th Century belongs to Canada"—if Canadians keep faith.
