SUNDAY GOLF AND CONCERTS OBJECTED TO

Edmonton City Has Received Protest from Ministerial Association

EDMONTON, June 13.—Protest has been registered by the Edmonton Ministerial association against the action of the city in operating a golf course, swimming pool and conducting band concerts in the parks on Sundays. A delegation of the Ministerial association which waited upon the attorney-general Thursday morning demanded that immediate steps should be taken by the government to put a stop to these amusements on the grounds that these public places of amusement had been operated contrary to the regulations of the Lord's Day act.

Referred Back

The attorney-general has given no decision on the matter and has referred the whole question back to the city to deal with as they see fit, and it is expected that the matter will be considered at the next council meeting.

In the past the city council has repeatedly been requested by the Ministerial association and other organizations to discontinue operating skating rinks for profit and other amusements on Sundays, but little or no attention has been given to the matter as most of the members of council were of opinion that the young people or, as a matter of fact, anyone at all would be better off at a skating rink or on the golf course than elsewhere.

Mayor Duggan is by no means favorable toward the request of the association, and it is not expected that he will recommend to council that the request should be complied with.

Band Concerts

The band concerts which are held in the parks on Sundays, it is said, are for the most part approved by the public and do much to make a visit to the parks more pleasant. It was also pointed out by the mayor that a large number of persons who are members of choirs also assist in the musical concerts in the parks and are well paid for their services.

As for the swimming pool and golf course, it is contended that a large number of people would be deprived of the use of these utilities entirely if they were not given an opportunity to make use of them on Sundays, which is the only time in the week when they can get away from their work.

SWIMMING CLUB NEED OF FUNDS

Season Advancing and no Improvements Yet Made at Salt Lake

A meeting of the Prince Rupert Swimming Club was held in the city police court last night for the purpose of devising ways and means for repairing the floats and dam, and filling in the children's pool at the Salt Lakes. The meeting was well attended. J. Roddie, president, occupied the chair and C. Westaway acted as secretary in the absence of A. McEwen who was appointed secretary for the ensuing season.

With the rapid advancement of the swimming season it was thought expedient that the work at the Salt Lakes should be undertaken as soon as possible. It had been found impossible to obtain the necessary financial support of the public to enable the repair work on the floats and dam to be carried out, therefore to provide for the work being done it was decided to instruct the secretary to write a letter to the city council asking their support to the extent of \$500 and also to approach the Rotary Club to ask for their financial aid. E. H. Shockey stated that the lumber from the old Bays Creek bridge would be floated through the creek and placed in the bay ready for towing to the lakes in the next few days. J. Roddie undertook to assist in towing the lumber across the harbor.
