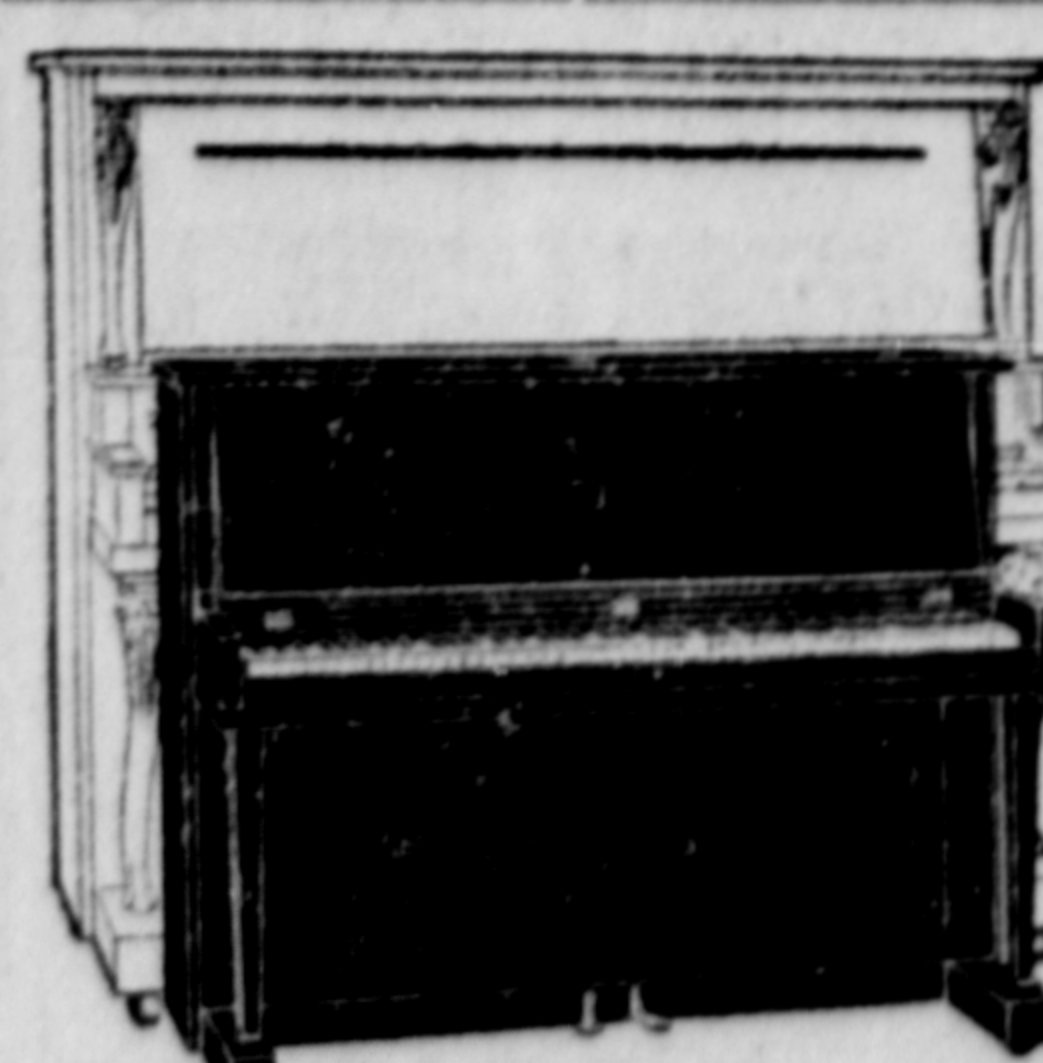

THAT STORY ABOUT C.P.R. TAKING OVER P.G.E. CRITICIZED

Edmonton Paper, Suggests C.P.R. Not Anxious for that Kind of Railway

Says the Edmonton Bulletin: Victoria, B.C., has broadcasted a rumor that the C. P. R. is aiming to get control of the Pacific & Great Eastern railway and extend it to connect with the E. D. & B. C., thus giving a direct route from Peace River to Vancouver. That no doubt is very cheering information, or mis-information, for the people at the coast and the taxpayers of British Columbia generally. Under the mis-guidance of a former government the people of that province undertook to construct a railway from Vancouver to Prince George, with the intention that it should ultimately extend to tap the Peace River country and draw a share of the trade of that fertile farming region to the Pacific port. The enterprise is by no means completed, but it has swallowed up so many millions that the project has been abandoned and it now stands as the most spectacular blunder in railroad construction that has been made in Canada. It may be that the C. P. R. is willing to take the elephant off the hands of the province, though as the despatch says, without paying very much for it, and to spend the huge sum that would be necessary to connect it with the line it now operates from this city to Spirit River. Should that be done the farmers and business men of the Peace River country will be given a new outlet to the Pacific, somewhat shorter than the present one, though not enough shorter to revolutionize traffic conditions, and Edmonton wholesalers will have to meet the competition of Vancouver rivals in what is now their exclusive territory. But it may be surmised that the idea is based as much upon hope as upon facts. The experience of Alberta in trying to sell the Blindman Valley railway to the C.P.R. warrants the view that that company is not particularly anxious to relieve the public of costly experiments in railway construction.

SAWMILLS AT LOS ANGELES

Concern That Manufactures Queen Charlotte Island Lumber is Busy

An article in the Los Angeles Examiner tells of the operations at San Pedro where the Queen Charlotte Islands lumber is being re-manufactured. It says:—

With the opening this past week of sales offices in the Hollingsworth building, Sixth and Hill Streets, the \$10,000,000 Los Angeles Lumber Products Company's Los Angeles Harbor plant has started production on a commercial scale.

The immense plant, occupying about thirty-five acres of the seventy-acre yard of the Los Angeles Shipbuilding and Drydock Corporation, will include, when under full operation, the main seven-hand saw mill, two complete box factory units, dry kilns, stacking yards, planing mill and loading station, and will be one of the most modern saw and milling plants of the Pacific Coast, employing upwards of 600 men when running under full operation.

The main saw mill, which is electrically operated, completed machinery tests last week and is now operating on one full eight-hour shift.

Box Factories

When the new box factories are running, according to Arno Meren, vice-president in charge of production, a second shift will be added.

Machinery tests of the first box factory unit were started this past week and should be completed soon, when box products materials are expected to be turned out in commercial quantities.

In the meantime construction work on the second box factory unit, which is to house the equipment of the Pacific Wirebound Box Factory, a subsidiary, recently purchased outright at San Francisco and which will be shipped to Los Angeles upon completion of the harbor factory, is under way.

The entire plant, including main saw mill, planing mill, box factories, transportation and other equipment is electrically operated and all machinery is equipped with the latest protective devices.

The Los Angeles plant, when in full operation, is expected to employ between 500 and 600 men.

FRUIT FROM B.C. INSTEAD OF U.S.

Mrs. King Brown Addresses Winnipeg Women on Behalf of Canadian Produce

WINNIPEG, June 14. — Mrs. King Brown is to address several women's organizations of this city in an endeavor to secure the co-operation of the women of the west in demanding fruit that carries the label of British Columbia, in preference to American apples which she finds this city "invariably stocked." She is the special representative of the Growers' Co-operative Union of British Columbia which comprises seventy-five per cent of the small fruit growers of that province. Many war veterans have taken up fruit growing, and it is necessary that a market should be provided, as last year thousands of boxes of apples, pears and small fruit were lost for lack of a market.
