EVANGELIZING NATIVE PEOPLE

Masset Christian Endeavor Society Visits Members of Tribe at Skidegate

A great effort is being made by Christian natives on this coast both in Canada and Alaska to Christianize the whole of the native population. Revival tours are being made in every direction, the natives travelling in their own boats and with their fine musical organizations and holding services in which high class musical productions predominate.

Word comes from Queen Charlotte Islands that 41 members of the Christian Endeavor Society of Massett invaded Skidegate and held a ten days' revival. The visitors were made welcome by the Southern Haidas and a great religious time was held.

The evangelistic bands are gradually extending their influence southward with good results.

THUNDERCLAP SAID TO BE SPECTACULAR

Sporting Life Illustrated in Picture Being Shown at Westholme

New York newspapers say that two of the most spectacular scenes ever registered on the screen take place in "Thunderclap." One is the hair-raising passage of the hero down a tempestuous rapids on the top of a board, and the other is the race track scene.

The story deals with sporting life and the gaming tables, and "Thunderclap" takes its title from the race horse upon whose victory the fortunes of the hero and the heroine rest. Plots and counterplots are set in motion to keep "Thunderclap" from winning, but with the aid of a good jockey, the crooked gambler's efforts are frustrated. The beginning of the picture discloses the suffering wife anxious to bring her child home from the convent and her husband, the child's stepfather, refusing to have the "brat" around the house. In a moment of desperation, the mother threatens to disclose the crooked methods of the gaming-house keeper if he does not grant her wish. The gambler strikes her and she becomes paralyzed from the shock losing the use of her limbs and her speech. An orphan boy drifts into the employ of the gambler, who is now running a fashionable establishment in a large city, and brings with him his horse, "Thunderclap."

The racer was bequeathed to the boy by the only kind employer he ever had. The gambler finding his business falling off ruinously, sends for his beautiful step-daughter to act as hostess of the gaming-house. Complications arise, and in desperation the gambler promises his daughter in marriage to an old reprobate with the understanding that \$40,000 is to be paid to the stepfather within a specified time. From then on the picture works up to its great climax, a climax as unusual as it is thrilling.

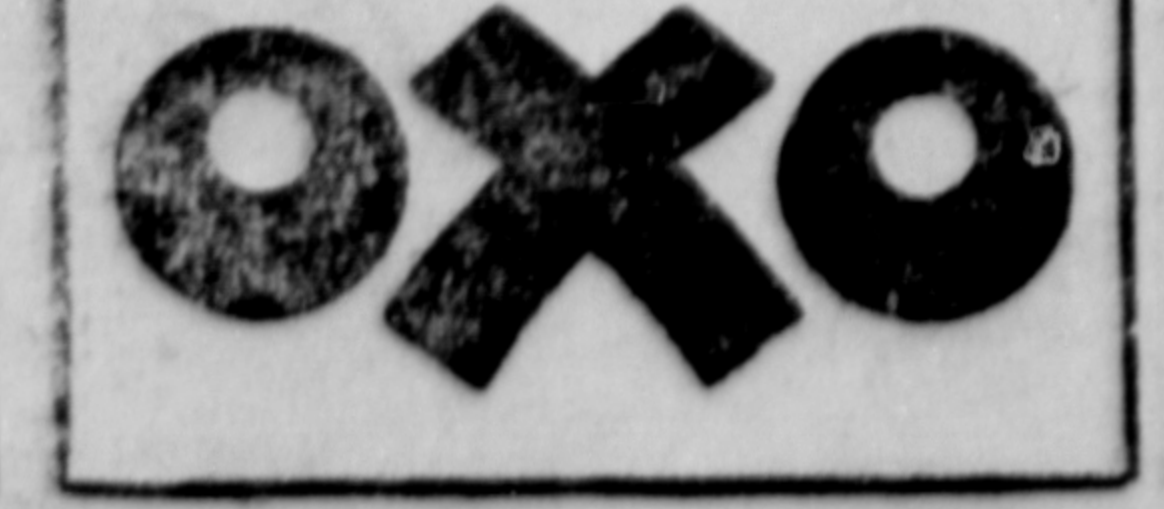
