The C.P.R. freighter Princess Ena, outbound for Skagway with a heavy freight cargo, and the C. G. M. M. Canadian Transporter, inbound from the Orient, had a collision at the entrance to Vancouver Harbor on Monday when a log boom in tow of the tug Wireless blocked the fairway in the First Narrows. Fortunately neither vessel was badly damaged. The Transporter is the vessel which will come here towards the end of the month for a cargo of lumber for Japan.
