CARS COLLIDED BUT NO ONE INJURED

Automobiles of Dr. W. T. Kergin and A. Jacobson Met at Corner Fulton St. and Third Avenue

A Ford Sedan car, driven by Dr. W. T. Kergin, and a Ford touring car, driven by A. Jacobson, collided at 10:15 last night at the intersection of Fulton Street and Third Avenue. No one was hurt. The collision occurred near the silent policeman recently placed at this intersection. Dr. Kergin had been driving down Fulton Street on the right side of the street and A. Jacobson, of Hays Cove Avenue, had been going east on Third Avenue on the right side of the street. Both drivers were apparently taken unawares with the result that they collided violently. As a result of the accident Dr. Kergin's car suffered considerable damage to the rear wheel while the rear of the car was broken, and a passenger inside was scratched. Jacobson's car was badly scratched on the front wheels, radiator and fender being broken.

Only Way Out
In spite of interests here such as the Cold Storage that might be hit, R. M. Sewell saw no other solution than closing the port. It was a case of life and death with the fishermen. The Cold Storage was, however, entitled to consideration. It was of great benefit to the Canadian fishermen, he admitted.
