CANON VERNON OF TORONTO PREACHED IN CITY YESTERDAY

Rev. Canon Vernon, of Toronto, general secretary of the council of social service of the Anglican Church in Canada, preached at both services in St. Andrew's Church yesterday. In the morning, Canon Vernon outlined the objects of the organization and told of some of the work that was being done. In the evening, he dealt with the subject of social purity telling of the duty of all men to their fellows both young and old.

Canon Vernon is spending a couple of days in the city on his way East after having attended the Synod of Westminister and meetings of the provincial synod in the south. He arrived on the Princess Beatrice on Saturday morning from Vancouver and leaves on tonight's train direct for Toronto.


