### Attempts To Withhold Public Information.

There are certain bodies functioning in the city of whose deliberations and actions it is the right of the public to know. This means that these organizations are dealing in public fundand with public affairs. It is not the place of these bodies or Romantic the members thereof to withhold their activities from the public. When an attempt is made to withhold information frem a newspaperman, such persons should remember that they are dealing not with the newspaperman personally but with the public at large. LONDON, Aug. 4 .--- A machine for armless men-simple in design and yet almost uncanny in its ingenuity-was demonstrated at a recent British Red Cross display. With the aid of a pair of metal levers attached to a table and manipulated by the feet, William Witt, who lost both arms in an accident four years ago, performed a series of operations to show what the machine could do. included taking soup, These drinking tea, peeling an egg. lighting a cigarette, working sewing machine, hammering in nails, playing draughts, writing, typewriting and replacing various implements from an overturned tool box. The utensils and tools used were ordinary ones affixed to the levers by special attachments. The machine, the invention of W. J. Thompson, an Edinburgh gasfitter, seems to be possessed of the acumen of Robot.
