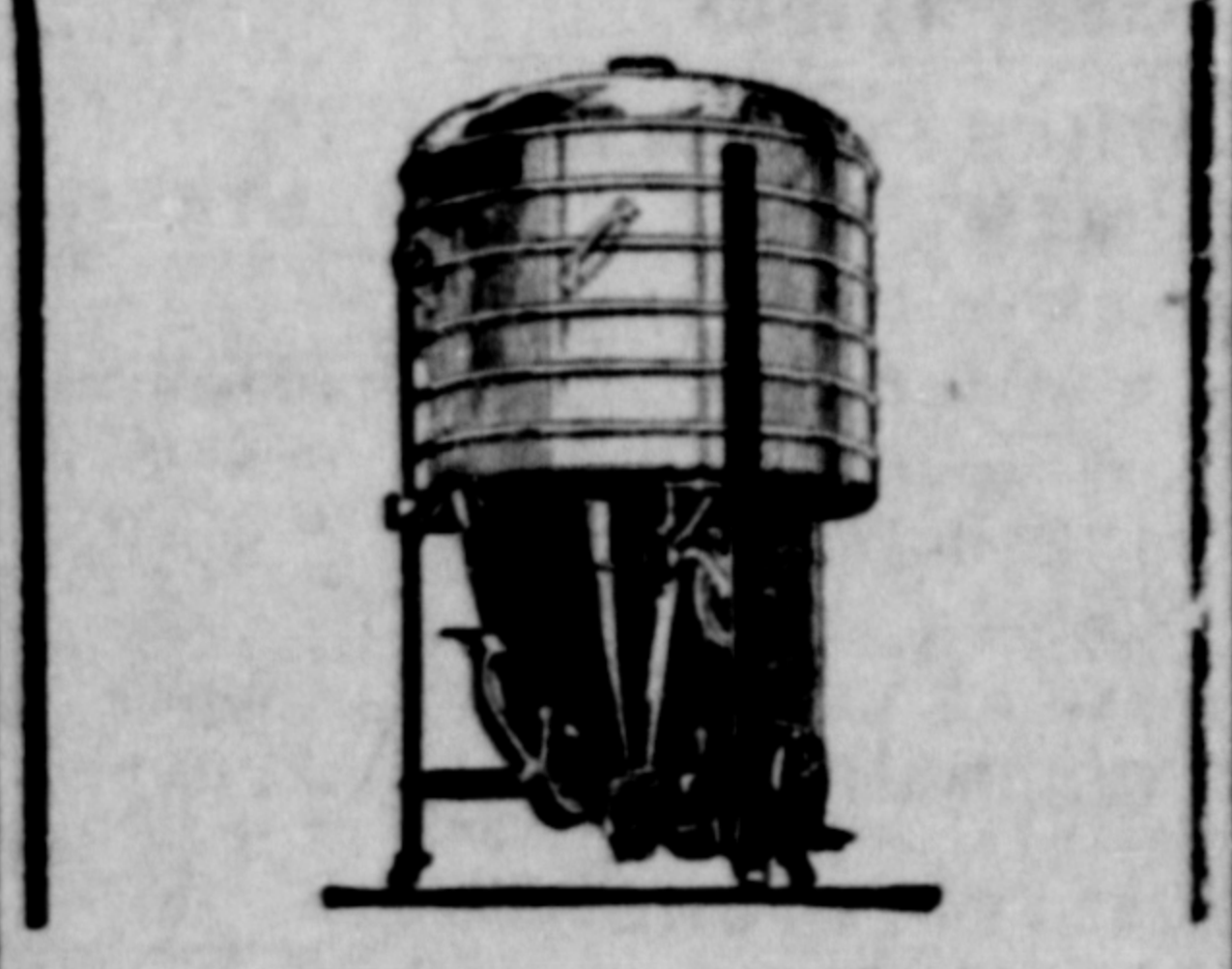

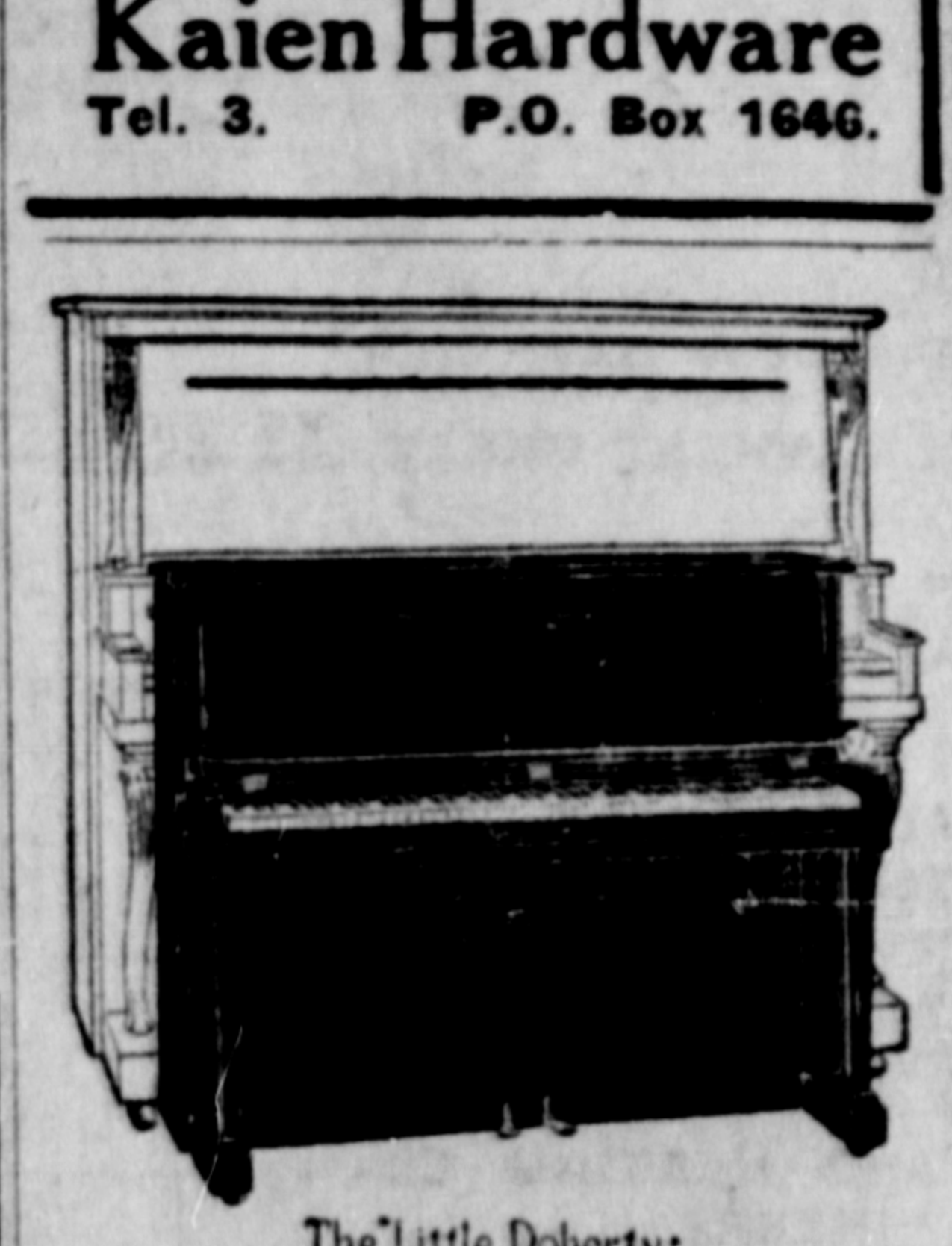

Mrs. Wm. Campbell of Winnipeg, formerly a resident of Prince George, is visiting Mr. and Mrs. D. G. Fraser.

Mrs. Pi. Dement of Eskbank, who has been visiting her mother Mrs. Henry Dodge in Beaverley district for the past two weeks, received news of the serious illness of her husband on Tuesday and left the same evening for her home in Saskatchewan.

P. E. Wilson has agreed to furnish the gold medals which will go to the winners of the Perry cup this year. There is a three-cornered fight for the cup this season as the McBride football team has entered the list of challengers and will fight the issue out with the Caledonian and Veterans' teams of this city.

Miss Esther McIlraith, who has been appointed matron of the girls' home in this city, is expected to arrive in Prince George on August 12, to make arrangements for the opening of the home with the commencement of the school term. The home will offer accommodation for twelve girls and is operated under the supervision of the Women's Missionary society of the Presbyterian church in Canada.

The Cranbrook saw mill has commenced to figure in the lumber shipments from this section in a very substantial manner. During the month of July the company shipped 25 cars of lumber to the eastern States market. If the necessary cars can be secured, even larger shipments will be made during the present month. The mill is performing even better than was hoped for when it was installed.
