



Each of the four members of the grain commission spoke yesterday at the Rotary luncheon and the addresses proved most interesting. The address of James Guthrie Scott of Quebec was of special note in that he acknowledged that Prince Rupert held a pivotal position and that he saw great things in store in future development.

Mr. Justice Turgeon said they realized that Prince Rupert aspired to be a grain shipping port and there was no doubt when the people of Canada first endorsed the project of the building of the railway they had in mind
