It was a good clean game and all the way through both teams put up a good fight for victory. Smithers made two runs in the first inning and in the second added another four runs. In the third inning Prince Rupert got to first base for the first time but failed to carry on while Smithers continued to add to the score. In the fourth inning the Prince Rupert players emerged from their lethargy and scored two runs, Smithers adding another count. Prince Rupert raised its tally to three in the fifth and Smithers contented itself with a score of eight. The remainder of the match was played in semi-darkness with no further scoring. 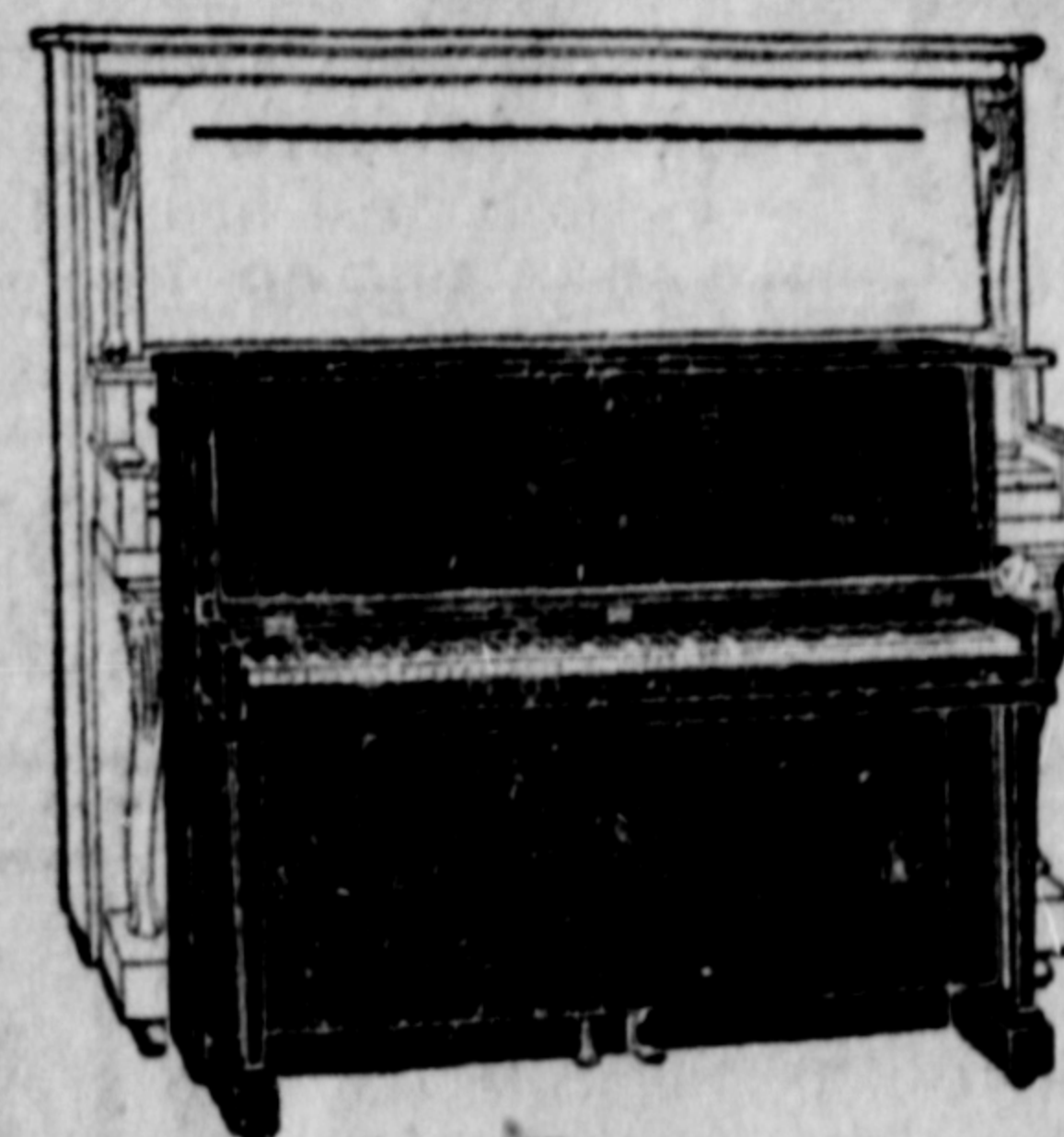
