URGES LABOR POLICY GOOD

H. G. Wells in Letter to Lady Warwick Gives His Views on Politics

In a letter to Lady Warwick H. G. Wells, the novelist and historian writes:

"I am very glad indeed to hear that you are standing for the central constituency of England in the Labor interest. I do not know the particular political conditions of Warwick and Leamington, but I know you will make a gallant fight for our party, and I believe that if the voters to whom you are appealing realise their duty to themselves, their children, and their country, you will be returned. For in stepping outside the ordinary political limitations of your class and your family associations to fight this election in the cause of Labor, you leave a world of privilege, faction, small party issue, narrowly-conceived polities; to join a great and growing body of men and women who have something more than the loyalties of faction and the consideration of expediency to guide them; whose political activities are based upon great constructive ideas, who have before their eyes as their rule and guide a vision of a better and more nobly organised state, founded upon justice and protecting the happiness and welfare not merely of privileged orders, but of every man and woman within the common weal.

Its Policy

"The Labor party has a clearly conceived and stated foreign policy, and a clearly conceived and stated domestic policy. Let me take but one instance of that clearness and definiteness—its educational policy. From no other party can the educational inquirer extract any definite promises or pledges of intention. 



the Labor party stands definitely for the educational state, a state in which every child shall have a full education up to the age of 16 at least, and the fullest opportunity for developing whatever exceptional capacity it possesses.

The Labor party alone makes it clear that no such political or social organisation as it desires is possible without a correlated education process. It stands for teachers in number adequate to the task before them, adequately educated not in special cheap training colleges, but in the universities, and adequately paid; and it stands for the school properly equipped.

Hits Singapore

These are the clear and definite promises. It will perform them even if it has to stop the building of Mr. Amery's useless battleships and his docks at Singapore. It is the anti-waste party. Particularly it is set against the waste of human possibility that under-education involves. It wants to see England a land not of uneducated drudges, but of capable men and women educated to the fullest possibilities. All ignorant men are slaves. Other parties may propose a lawdry patriotism and sing 'Britons never shall be slaves.' They don't mean it. See what they consider a fair wage for the workers everywhere, for farm laborers, industrial workers, teachers, doctors, and every class of worker. The Labor party means it to the very roots of its being."

Yes, I know you can add other elements which also produce an effect. (Laughter.) But the point I want to make is that two forces united in the right way, in true proportions, will not represent simply the sum of two, but will be something different in kind and greater in power and potentiality. That is the truth which we in the British Empire have to learn. We have to learn that if the different Dominions—Canada, Australia, New Zealand, Africa, Newfoundland, the Great Empire of India—all join together with the Mother Country, the sum of the result will be something more than all these things combined. It will not be a mere group of

nations working together and mutually serving each other; it will be a new power, a new influence, not only for these nations themselves, but for the whole human society. It is this conception which we have in the Conference which we are holding at the present time. We believe that if out of it we can bring a greater unity, if out of it we can demonstrate to each and all in a truer way our united purpose and aim, we will have helped to bring into being in a larger way a power that is vastly by far than has ever existed before—a power that will be enduring in the mutual service of its different parts—a power that will also be enduring in its influence among the nations for justice, peace, and good-will among the people of the earth."
