Splendid Time at Regimental Headquarters Enjoyed by Men

### TROPHIES PRESENTED

Event was to Celebrate Famous Regina Trench When 102nd Went Over

A regimental smoker was held Saturday night at the regimental headquarters. Major John Nicholls presiding, and the guests of honor being Captain Oland of the Patriotic and Capt. Pressy of the mine sweeper Thiepval and their officers, non-commissioned officers and crew, as well as Mayor Newton and a number of prominent citizens who had been especially invited for the occasion. There was a most varied program of events including speeches and songs and boxing bouts and in the course of the evening refreshments were served. The program included addresses by Major Nicholls, Chaplain Major Rix, Fred Stork, and Consul Wakefield. Songs were given by Eddie Crags, S. K. Campbell, J. R. Mitchell, Algie Hunter, H. Fletcher, and the band played selections. In addition

there was an exhibition of drilling by Sub-Lt. Denis. The Regimental band played selections at intervals and the whole proved a most enjoyable event.

### Prize Winners

In presenting the prizes for shooting Fred Stork complimented the regiment on the progress they were making. The prize list and scores showed the excellence of the work done. He was glad to be there to say a few words of encouragement. He welcomed the officers and men of the Patriotic and the Thiepval. He had suggested to the minister that the vessels should come here and had been promised that they would make more frequent visits. He hoped that within a few years there would be a naval base at Prince Rupert. He congratulated the regiment on the excellent entertainment they had put up and especially on the many sports in which they had been engaged. The prize winners were as follows:

Regimental cup for 1923 for the highest average of the best eight scores and gold medal won by B.S. W. S. Brown with an average of 86.5 points; the second in this contest was Pte. W. Brass with 84.6 and Lieut. A. M. Davies third with 84.1.

Trophies won at the regimental shoot on Sept. 30. Gold medal, Pte. A. Wylie; silver medal, Pte. A. N. Smith; bronze medal, Capt. R. W. Cameron and turkey, Lieut. A. M. Davies.

For second class shots prizes presented by Bulger & Cameron. Silver medal, Pte. R. Wilson; bronze medal, C.Q.M.S. R. E. Hudson.

It was pointed out that the best score for the season at the three ranges was made by W. M. Brown with a total of 92, with W. Brass second 91, and A. Wylie third, 90. The only perfect score made during the season was that of A. M. Davies at 200 yards when he scored the possible 35.

**Major Nicholls**

In his address Major Nicholls, the commanding officer, welcomed the ex-members of the 102nd battalion. He explained that the event was to celebrate the famous occasion when they first went over the top at Regina Trench on the Somme. Since 1919 a dinner had been given in Vancouver in honor of the occasion and it was the intention to do the same here in future.

Mr. Nicholls welcomed the officers and men of the Patriotic and Thiepval. They were humble before the members of the senior service but their humility did not detract from the heartiness of their welcome. He also welcomed the other visitors and said they were trying to show what was being done to provide a place where the youth of the city could enjoy manly exercise under

a healthy environment. They were not asking for financial assistance but they wanted the moral assistance of everyone in bringing to the attention of the young men the advantages to be obtained there.

In speaking to the members of the First Northern B.C. Regiment the commanding officer said the regiment was formed to perpetuate the 102nd and they must consider it their solemn and sacred duty to be worthy of the name. Several other speakers followed.
