Sockeye Fishing Season Opens with Good Catches on Skeena Thirteen Canneries Operating

With the opening of the sockeye season after midnight fire place, lecture room, kitchen- Tuesday night, yesterday was the first fishing day on the Skeena River and the canning industry is now about to start in full swing, although there are yet only a limited number of gill nets out. According to reports received at the Dominion Fisheries office last night the highest boat took 45 sockeyes which is a larger catch than that of the highest boat on the opening, day last year.

Of the sixteen canneries on the Skeena River, thirteen are canning this year. The three canneries which are not operating are the B.A. at Port Essington, which was destroyed by fire few weeks ago, Oceanic, which will be operated this year as camp, and Alexander.
