DETROIT HAS PLENTY LIQUOR

Most of it Made at Home and
Labelled Canadian It is As-
serted

DETROIT, Mich., June 21.—Beer and liquor are obtainable at scores of places in the heart of Detroit, in road houses, in the cutting districts and in restaurants, soft drink establishments and similar places in the city and in Ecorse, Wyandotte and other down river towns. But more than fifty per cent of the illicit beverages sold is made in and around Detroit.

This is the consensus of opinion of rum runners, police, federal and local peace officers and Canadian customs officials. The bootleggers who are selling alleged Canadian whiskey claim that it is genuine Canadian—but they stand alone in their assertions.

The runners who are operating boats across the Canadian river—and they are openly and steadily at it—admit that they are not transporting much whiskey.

An operator sat in his boat at Petit Cote, the Canadian terminal for the beer running fleet, taking on a load.

"Whiskey running is falling off," he said. "In the first place there is little demand. The Americans are apparently getting all the whiskey they want, but it isn't coming from Canada. Our customers over there don't ask us for whiskey. They want beer."

400 Gallons a Day

This operator averages about 400 gallons of beer a day in his out board motor row boat. He makes, at fifty cents a case, about \$65 for four trips. He clears his boat from the Canadian port with regular clearance papers, labelled "Beer for export." When he leaves port he can't go back until his cargo has been discharged, and he has been coming

in and out for three years.

Customs officials at Windsor, who are in close touch with the amount of liquor and beer taken out of the country, refuse to disclose figures. But one of them said, "anyone who thinks they are running large quantities of whiskey is crazy."

The cafe and road house owners, and proprietors of other establishments on this side where liquor is sold, do not get their "hard" liquor from Canada. It is the claim of the runners. Many of them buy it as Canadian liquor, but it is actually made in Detroit and fitted with counterfeit labels.

Import to Canada

Canadian distillery officials scoff at the stories of great quantities of whiskey going across the river. They claim that they have more business than they can handle, and that it would be exceedingly difficult for anyone to get the men to smuggle. In fact, there have been cases reported to the customs officials where attempts were made to smuggle alleged Canadian liquor from Detroit into Canada, to be disposed of in Windsor. One shipment was confiscated. It was tested and found to be alcohol, colored and flavored.

Detroit is wet. One can order beer by the case, and it will be delivered to his home. It is possible to obtain whiskey in many hotels. In the heart of the city, beer, wine and whiskey are sold openly. Synthetic gin is plentiful. But tracing down every possible source, and the conclusion invariably reached is that not more than 15,000 or 16,000 gallons of beer and whiskey—and virtually all of it is beer—are coming across or under the Detroit river. Home brew, sometimes disguised as brewery beer, "faked" whiskey, in Canadian labelled bottles, and synthetic gin, in bottles labelled as pre-prohibition gin, are dispensed freely.

But more than fifty per cent of Detroit wetness is manufactured in Detroit.

5,000 VISIT LINER DORIC

Official Welcome to Bin New
Steamer at Montreal Yesterday

MONTREAL, Que., June 21.—Greeted by siren-blasts from all the ships in port the new White Star Dominion liner Doric, the largest ship that ever entered the harbor of Montreal, docked here at 10 o'clock yesterday morning after an uneventful maiden voyage from Liverpool and Belfast. The passage of the Doric was retarded by two days of bad weather but her performance in view of the caution always displayed on a first voyage was considered highly satisfactory by officials of the line. The big ship, gaily decorated with bunting, was welcomed to Montreal by many well known shipping officials, including M. P. Pennell, general manager of the port, who extended the welcome of the harbor commissioners to Capt. John Davies, the Doric's veteran commander. Others at the pier included Major P. A. Curry, general manager of the White Star Dominion lines, Capt. J. E. Symonds, harbor master; Capt. R. C. Brown, port warden; L. S. Tobin, C. E. Mason and L. A. Collins, of the White Star Dominion lines.

In the afternoon the ship was thrown open to the public and a throng estimated at nearly five thousand persons visited the liner during the space of four hours. Today the company will entertain large gatherings at luncheon and dinner, when many prominent citizens will be the company's guests.

The Doric will sail for Liverpool on Saturday and thereafter be in regular service on the St. Lawrence route.
