### Manson Tells Legislature that Commissioner Smith Unfair in Mounted Police Investigation

VICTORIA, Dec. 8 .- Commending his counsel, C. L. Harrison, for withdrawing from further appearance before the Royal Commission investigating charges against the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Attorney General Manson informed the Legislature that he had regretfully come to the conclusion that Commissioner Smith had not a proper conception of the commission imposed upon him. He said: "He has put such a narrow construction on it that his investigation is not in the interest of the public nor of the department he seems so anxious
