UNION BANK IS ON SOUND BASIS

Irregularities in Foreign Exchange Cause Reorganization With Reduced Dividend

STATEMENT IS ISSUED

WINNIPEG, June 22.—The Union Bank of Canada today issued a statement to its shareholders regarding its affairs. It said in part that shortly after the last annual general meeting the then general manager reported to the president and directors the discovery of certain unauthorized transactions in foreign exchange from which considerable loss resulted to the bank which loss had been fully provided for. Having regard, however, to all surrounding circumstances and in view of the change of the general management of the bank a thorough examination and revaluation of the bank's assets was later decided upon. This valuation was conducted by high executive officers of the bank, auditors and an executive officer of the Bank of Montreal loaned for the purpose. The valuation was now completed and after earnest consideration there had been a transfer from the rest account to contingent reserve of the sum of \$1,200,000 and a reduction of the dividend to shareholders of from ten to eight per cent. The institution had been placed on a sound footing, the sum of \$1,750,000 being left to the credit of the rest account. The report further stated that the officers were looking forward with confidence to the future of the institution. They secure the shareholders in their belief in the fundamental soundness of the bank's position and point out that all bad and doubtful accounts are provided for and not only is the bank's capital unimpaired but its rest account is still substantial.

RATS WERE FED BY LADY WHO TAMED THEM

Jersey City Officials Had to Remove Corposes in Baskets After Slaughter

NEW YORK, June 22.—(By Canadian Press)—Mrs. Mary Tobin, who lives at 266 Old Bergen Road, Jersey City, recently discovered a rat in her house. Being afraid of it, she did not like to incur its enmity by appearing inhospitable, so she decided to be friendly. She tossed it bits of bread and placed a saucer of milk for it on the floor. Nothing loath to accept these evidences of good will, the rat ate the bread, drank the milk and departed. Mrs. Tobin congratulated herself on her tact in dealing with her unwelcome visitor. A day or so later, however, she was horrified by another visit from the rat, who came with a dozen companions to show his appreciation of her kindness. Mrs. Tobin was so terrified but did not know how to get rid of them, so she pursued her former plan of making friends. Each day she placed pans of milk for them about the house and generously distributed loaves of bread, some days going so far as to take no less than ten extra loaves for her anxious guests. This went on for over a fortnight, during which time the rodents made themselves thoroughly at home. Their ranks increased daily until the noise they made attracted the attention of Mrs. Tobin's neighbors, who notified health officials. But Mrs. Tobin had gone too far to draw back. Her only salvation lay in gaining the rats' affection, so, thinking to endear herself to them, she built a ladder from a hole they had made in the floor to another in the roof. This enabled the rodents to stage a "Rat Revue" in the open air every night, motorists came from far and near to witness, illuminating the "revue" with their lights. Finally health officers intervened, and prepared a banquet for the rats consisting of bread soaked in arsenic. One official stated that when he entered the kitchen the floor was covered with nearly a hundred rats, who paid not the slightest attention to him. They were, he affirmed, absolutely fearless, and one actually licked his hand. After the banquet the rats were removed in baskets.

ACTIVITY IN MINING STILL AT SMITHERS

Duthie Examines Property in Babine: Road Building Progresses Fast

SMITHERS, June 22.—B. W. Howard, of Edmonton, Alta., was on a business trip here in connection with his mining claims on Hudson's Bay Mountain. Seen before he left for home by way of Prince Rupert and Vancouver, he stated he was very much pleased with the prospects and expects to return shortly to start development work.

J. F. Duthie, accompanied by mining engineers and experts is on a visit of inspection to the Harvey group in the Babines. It is stated that should the examination prove favorable, Mr. Duthie will purchase this group.

Work is progressing steadily on the Hudson's Bay Mountain. The new government road to the Duthie holdings is making good headway, and with the completion of the installation of the new machinery now at the mine, shipments of ore will be under way before long.

It is understood that much building activity will soon be seen on Mr. Duthie's property as he intends erecting several cottages for his employees in addition to other camp structures.

The Guggenheim people, who are operating on Dome Mountain, are stated to have an option on the Judge Group, and are to inspect and report within a short time.
