EITHER WORK OR LEAVE IT

No Half Way Measure Can Continue Here Longshoremen Are Notified

Local shipping officials this morning notified the I.L.A. that there would be no half way method in connection with the longshoremen's strike. The men would either have to handle the cargoes of all ships or none at all.

Notification to this effect was given at a conference between N. B. Walton, C.N.R. superintendent; Reginald Beaumont, C.G.M.M. local superintendent; A. S. Paul, manager of the Pacific Stevedoring Co.; F. W. Reich, secretary of the local longshoremen's union; and Charles Lang, also of the union.

Asked by the officials what the intention of the union was, the union representatives stated that they would not unload ships loaded by unfair labor as long as the strike was in progress, but they would handle other freight. They were notified that they would have to handle everything or nothing.

The shipping concerns expect to have no difficulty in handling the boats here. Volunteer labor will be used until the strike is ended.

HOARDED GOLD IS BEING PAID INTO ENGLISH SAVINGS

LONDON, Oct. 17.—Gold which has been hoarded for years is being dug up in this country and paid into the savings banks. People in town and country, men and women, are finding gold with which to purchase savings bank certificates. For many years this gold has lain idle and the interest which it would have brought has been lost. Compounded in many kinds of securities this money would almost have doubled itself in ten years.

ESQUIMALT ANXIOUS TO BID ON VESSELS FOR C.P.R. FLEET

VICTORIA, Oct. 17.—At a meeting of the Esquimalt Board of Trade at the Sailors' Club recently, R. H. Pooley, M.P.P., and Reeve Lockley, were appointed a committee to interview Norman Yarrow, of Yarrow, Ltd., in regard to the feasibility of building the two new ships for the Canadian Pacific Railway in British Columbia. The committee was instructed to enlist the co-operation of the Chamber of Commerce, and to make every effort to convince the Canadian Pacific Railway officials that Pacific coast yards should be given an opportunity to bid on this work.

ANXIETY IN INDIA OWING TO CRIMES

Political Plotters Said to be Involved in Acts of Violence

CALCUTTA, Oct. 17.—In protesting the Bengal Legislative Council, Lord Lytton, the Governor, voiced a note of anxiety and warning regarding the recent recrudescence of violent crime in Calcutta and other parts of the province. These outbreaks are attributed to the work of secret revolutionary societies, having as one of their aims the assassination of government officials.

"The crimes of violence which have in the last few months deeply shocked the public of Calcutta have been generally assumed to have been the acts of ordinary criminals. The latest murder in the post office at San-karitolla and the trial and conviction of one of the gang who committed the murder has revealed to the public the workings of organized revolutionary societies of which Bengal has had such an unhappy experience in the past. The revival of a menace, which many will remember as a hideous nightmare, and which everyone had hoped had gone forever, has created a situation in which the government will require, to an exceptional degree, the support of the public.

"The contaminating influence of these gangs of fanatical idealists, who adopt terrorism through robbery and assassination as their weapon, is a danger to the younger generation from which no family can feel altogether immune."

Sergeant McIlnechy summoned Dr. J. P. Cade, city doctor, and Constable Macdonald and proceeded to the scene. Stewart was found prone on the street in a very intoxicated condition. He was taken to the lock-up instead of the morgue.

BERLIN, Oct. 17.—A majority of the automobiles owned in Berlin are the property of persons between 20 and 25 years old. Youth has availed itself of the gambling chances which have presented themselves in the kaleidoscopic changes which have come in the financial situation in Germany, and most of the new rich are youngsters.
