QUEEN CHARLOTTES

W. Fairbairn has been appoint-
ed fisheries overseer for the
southern section of the waters
surrounding the Queen Char-
lotte Islands.

The Indians are awaiting the
arrival of packing boats for the
disposal of their fish at Hippo
and Langara Islands. The price
has not yet been fixed between
the trollers and the buyers.

The Indians of Skidegate, are
catching a large number of blue
back salmon in Copper Bay for
home consumption. One boat re-
ports a catch of one hundred
salmon a few nights ago. Under
the new regulations, Indians are
permitted to fish for salmon in
the rivers and inlets on condi-
tion of having a permit and not
disposing of any of their fish to
outside parties. They are salt-
ing the blue backs for winter
use.

Dr. Newcombe, who was a fre-
quent visitor in the north many
years ago, paid a visit to Queen
Charlotte City on May 22. A
number of old residents wel-
comed the return of the gentle-
man who is accompanying his
son.

F. L. Buckley, accompanied by
one of the directors of the Mas-
selt Timber Co., paid a visit to
Buckley Bay last week on their
launch which has been refitted
and arrived from Vancouver.
They left a few days later for the
large terminal city.

James McKay and Charles
Gladstone, two members of
Skidegate band, launched their
new motor boats last week. The
vessels were constructed, and the
engines were installed by the two
owners. Both vessels show the
fine workmanship of the Haidas.
Over one hundred boats, driven
by gasoline engines will engage
in trolling for spring salmon,
near Hippo and Langara islands.
The boats been owned and operat-
ed by Indians of Masselt and
Skidegate.

The drowning of a young man,
who disappeared from a Peter-
boro canoe on Masselt Inlet a few
weeks ago while out on the
waters at the head of the inlet, is
very much deplored by his as-
sociates and friends. Search has
been made for the remains with-
out avail on account of the
depth of water where the acci-
dent occurred.

An industrious Islander is
negotiating for the purpose of
placing an automobile on the
forty miles of roadway between
Tel-el river and Skidegate. The
installation of an auto would
mean the shortening the time of
travelling from Skidegate to Port
Clements. At the present time,
no motor driven vehicles are in
use on the highways of the is-
lands although notices have
been posted instructing "Chaf-
feurs to restrain from driving
the vehicles at a pace faster than
fifteen miles an hour." The
owners of horse-drawn vehicles
and bull teams are considering
the question of protesting
against such an arbitrary law.

Mr. Richardson, sr., of Tel-el,
has been appointed Stipendiary
Magistrate, John L. Barge has
also been gazetted as a Justice
of the Peace for the Islands, with
Stipendiary Magistrate W. Mal-
lory. The law officers will each
occupy separate portions of the
islands, J. L. Barge, J.P., resid-
ing at Queen Charlotte City, Mr.
Richardson, S.M., at Tel-el, and
Mr. Mallory, S.M., at Port Cle-
ments and Buckley Bay.

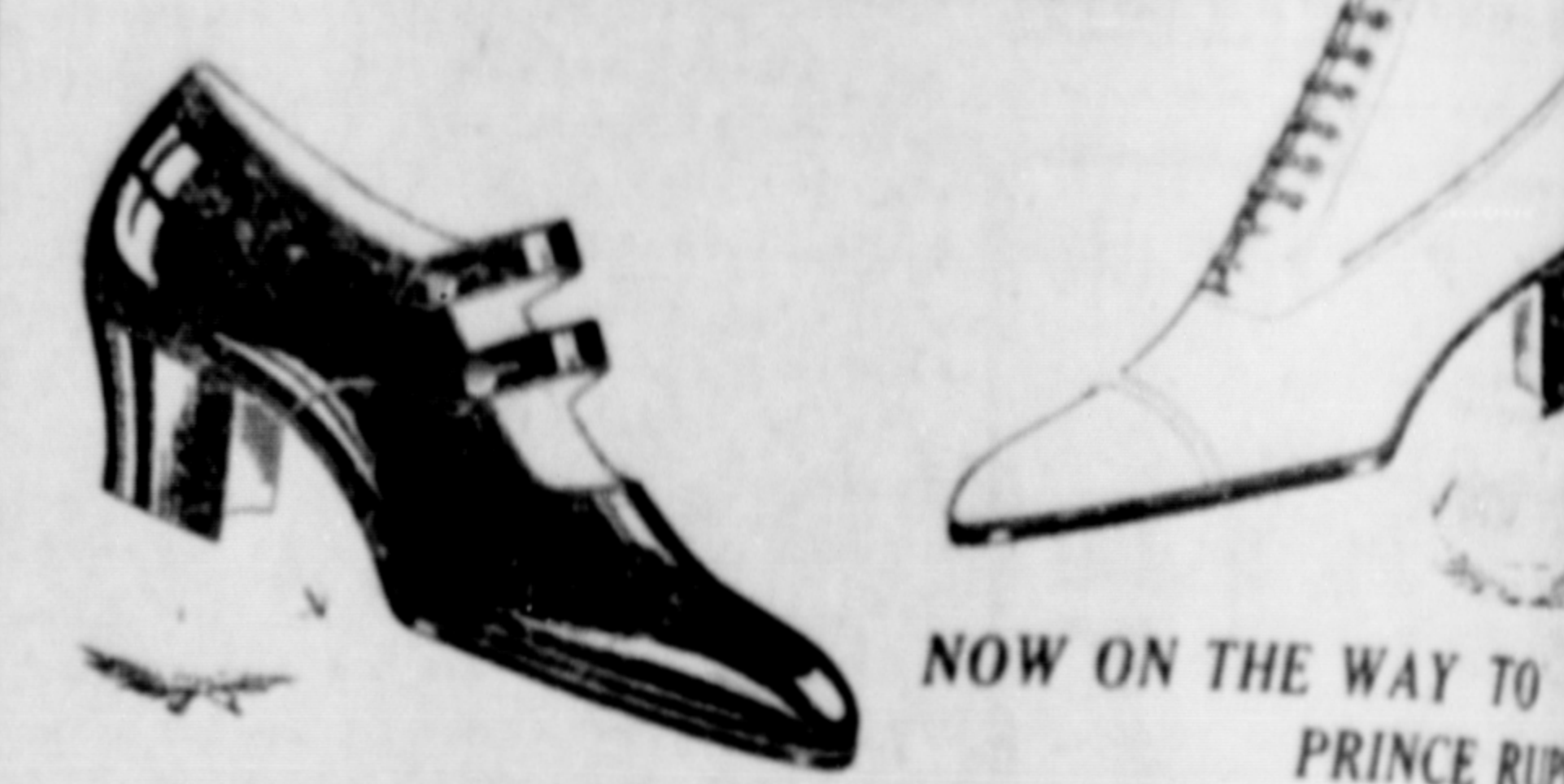
