C. Hanbury Williams Visits The Hot Springs and is Much Pleased

STRAWBERRY CENTRE

Trail Was Rough

They are five miles from Terrace as the crow flies but you have to bump for some twelve miles over a rough and muskeggy trail before getting to the foot of the lake and there you have to unpack and load all your stuff on to a boat and row six or seven miles to the Lodge. Many Attractions The whole place lies in a sort of basin surrounded by moun-

tains of some five or six thousand feet, where goats and sheep are to be seen and have been so far very little hunted. The lake is full of fish; two visitors from Prince Rupert killed fifty in a couple of hours while I was there and I saw them myself pulling them out one after the other. We rowed one day down to the outlet and the salmon were rolling in and about like porpoises, there were usually half a dozen at least breaking water at the same time. The air is splendid; you are only twenty-five miles from salt water in a straight line, so that you get mountain air and sea air combined. As for the shooting I cannot speak from personal experience, but I saw plenty of geese and duck on the water, and I am told that there are plenty of blue grouse in the woods alongside, and that bears are singularly numerous.
