The city had to give reasonable notice to its employees and he considered it was up to them to do the same. There was no one in the employ of the city whose services were indispensable.

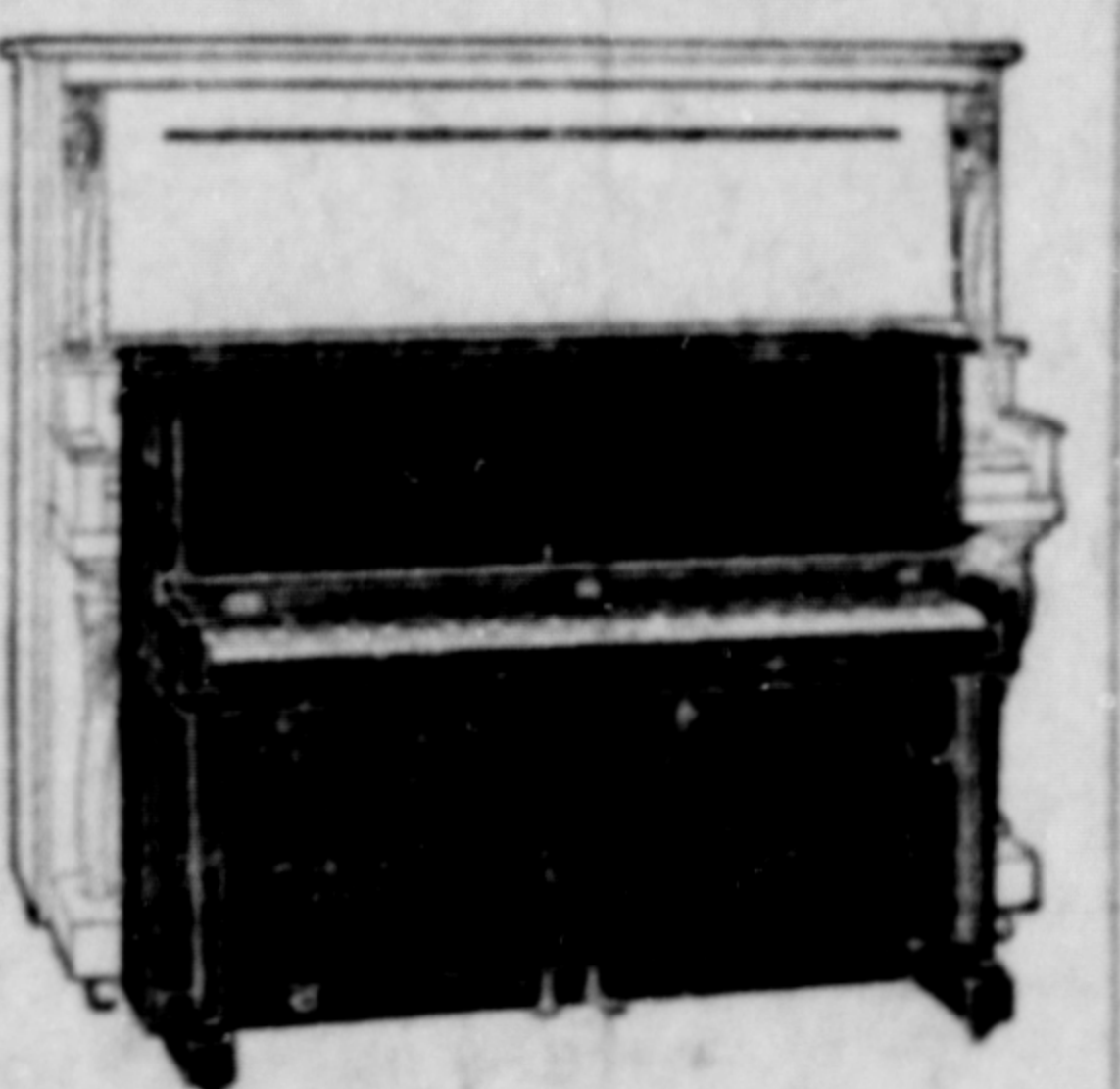
Ald. Collart moved that the matter be referred to the Finance committee for report, which was seconded by Ald. Stephens and the motion carried.
