Thrown From Car in President Harding's Party at Denver

DENVER, June 26.—Three prominent newspapermen, members of President Harding's party, were killed when a car which they were riding on Bear Canyon became out of control and went over the embankment. The victims were Sumner Curtis, member of the Republican national committee; Donald Craig, of the New York Herald; and Thomas F. Dawson, Colorado State historian and newspaperman. All died of injuries received.

MANY IMMIGRANTS FROM OLD COUNTRY SHIPPING BOOKED UP

LONDON, June 26.—With the departure of 4,200 emigrants from the Clyde for Canada and the United States Saturday, a total of 4,500 left Glasgow for overseas in two days. The shipping companies state that they are fully booked for three months.
