

Musial Heads All-Star Poll Second Year

CHICAGO (AP)—Nine different teams are honored on the American and National League All-Star teams for the second year in a row. The poll conducted by the Chicago Tribune was headed by Stan Musial, brilliant St. Louis Cardinal outfielder, who bagged 1,291,532 votes in the far-flung balloting. The first-place New York Yankees and Cleveland Indians eliminated the American League's three starters each. Chicago White Sox and Boston Red Sox landed one apiece.

The National League's eight starters included two each from Cardinals, first-place Brooklyn Dodgers and runner-up New York Giants, and one apiece from Chicago Cubs and Philadelphia Phillies.

Here's the way the 3,991,284 voting fans ordered Managers Stengel of the Americans and Leo Durocher of the Nationals to start the All-Star teams.

SPORTS ROUND-UP

CINCINNATI—Brooklyn and New York, running one-two in the National League pennant race, will provide 12 of the 25 players on the squad opposing an American League outfit in the annual major league all-star game at Philadelphia July 8.

Make-up of the National League's all-star group was announced today through the office of President Warren Giles.

Leo Durocher, as manager of last year's pennant-winning New York Giants, will pilot the all-stars and under game rules he'll be required to use in the first three innings the eight players selected in a vote of the fans.

Durocher picked the remaining members of the squad and all of the pitchers.

There will be eight "freshmen" to all-star competition on the senior loop's outfit. The "old men" of the team will be Stan Musial and Enos Slaughter of the St. Louis Cardinals and Peeewe Reese of Brooklyn Dodgers. Musial and Slaughter will be on the all-star squad for the ninth time and it will be Reese's eighth appearance.

Here is the complete squad:

Pitchers—Sal Maglie, New York; Robin Roberts and Curt Simmons, Philadelphia; Preacher Roe, Brooklyn; Bob Rush, Chicago; Warren Spahn, Boston, and Gerry Staley, St. Louis.

Catchers—Roy Campanella, Brooklyn; Wes Westrum, New York, and Atwell, Chicago.

Infielders—Alvin Dark, Whitey Lockman and Bob Thomson, New York; Gil Hodges, Peeewe Reese and Jackie Robinson, Brooklyn; Red Schoendienst, St. Louis; Granny Hamner, Philadelphia, and Grady Hatton, Cincinnati.

Outfielders—Carl Furillo and Duke Snider, Brooklyn; Ralph Kiner, Pittsburgh; Stan Musial and Enos Slaughter, St. Louis, and Hank Sauer, Chicago.

Under that set-up the Dodgers will be represented by seven players, New York by five, St. Louis by four, Philadelphia and Chicago by three each and Cincinnati, Boston and Pittsburgh by one each.

Durocher named Manager Eddie Stanky of St. Louis Cards and Frank Shellenback of the Giants as his coaches.

UBC Committee Aids Planning For Games

VANCOUVER (CP)—The University of British Columbia has agreed in principle to place its facilities at the disposal of the British Empire Games Society for the 1954 sport meet.

Norman A. MacKenzie, president, has appointed a special committee, headed by Prof. Robert Osborne, which is meeting with the B.E.G. society's legal committee and the B.E.G. facilities committee, to draw up final plans.

Many details have to be ironed out before university authorities and the society officials sign an agreement.

Seating capacity of the stadium, now less than 5,000, must be enlarged to accommodate at least 40,000 spectators.

At one stage, President MacKenzie said no more than 7,000 seats would be allowed to remain and expressed the institution's disinterest in having major sports events staged on the campus. However, it is reliably reported this attitude has

Indians Edge Browns 3-2; Yankees Lose

NEW YORK (CP)—Cleveland Indians battled to a 10-inning 3-2 victory over St. Louis Browns Wednesday, which left them in second place in the American League, three games behind New York Yankees.

Yankees were edged 5-4 by Boston Red Sox while the Chicago White Sox squeezed out Detroit Tigers 3-2.

Only 12 percentage points now separate Cleveland from the fifth place Washington Senators. Boston and Chicago are 31 1/2 games off the pace.

Philadelphia Phillies tripped Brooklyn Dodgers twice in a National League doubleheader 4-3 and 2-1 but New York Giants lost a golden opportunity to move close to the league leaders by dropping a 2-1 verdict to Boston Braves.

The hapless Pittsburgh Pirates, deep in the cellar, lost two games to Chicago Cubs.

Boston's DiMaggio finished second to Musial in the individual vote-getting with 1,279,818 for the American League centre field job. Brooklyn's Robinson was third with 1,266,398, followed by Berra with 1,252,791, and Sauer with 1,241,094.

The total of 3,991,284 votes were channeled from 305 newspapers and radio stations in the United States, Canada, Hawaii, Puerto Rico and Mexico, not to mention stray ballots from Germany, France, Korea, Japan, Cuba and Venezuela.
