**WOODWORTH LAKE DAM IS LEAKING**

Superintendent of Utilities Authorized by City Council Last Night to Make Temporary Repairs

The superintendent of utilities was authorized by the city council last night to make temporary repairs to the Woodworth Lake dam which was reported to be leaking.

The report of the superintendent on the matter said the dam was leaking in the front and at the sides. There was no immediate danger but repairs of at least a temporary nature should be made.

Ald. Macdonald said that the dam was to be thoroughly examined and a more detailed report would be forthcoming at a later date.
