**J. Conrad  
New District  
CNR Engineer**

VANCOUVER—The appointment of J. Conrad to the post of district engineer, Canadian National Railways, British Columbia district, with headquarters here, was announced today by R. H. Robertson, of Vancouver, general superintendent of the district. Mr. Conrad replaces the veteran St. J. Munroe, who retired on June 30.

Born at St. Moritz, Switzerland, Mr. Conrad joined the railway at Kamloops as a rodmán in 1928. He was promoted to inspector in 1929 and until 1940 he served throughout the B.C. district in that capacity and as an instrumentman.

In 1941, Mr. Conrad was appointed resident engineer at Kamloops and in 1948 was raised to assistant district engineer for the B.C. district.

He went to Winnipeg as district engineer in 1950 and a year later was promoted to construction engineer on the big Lynn Lake project in northern Manitoba.

SAULT STE. MARIE, Ont. (CP)—Born without arms, Raymond Sageloloy, 22, learned to play the piano and guitar with his toes.

In his teens he tried desperately to crack the radio field as a disk jockey.

He continued studying the technicalities of radio. After years of painstaking experiments he constructed with his toes a new entertainment machine which combines a record player and movies. He calls it rec vision. It provides recorded music together with black and white or colored movies of singers or bands.

To an ordinary record he attaches a miniature transmitting cylinder which contains 35-mm. film. The cylinder transmits micro-sound waves which are transformed into electronic rays and finally form an image on the screen.

**CN Steamship  
Engineers  
Get New Posts**

VANCOUVER—Three appointments, involving senior positions in the Canadian National Steamships organization on the Pacific Coast, have been announced by Superintendent G. A. MacMillan, Vancouver. Appointments follow retirement of W. E. Baillie, superintendent engineer.

Leslie V. Wilson, a native of Nanaimo, who has been chief engineer on the company's palatial ss. Prince George since she went into service in 1948, has been appointed engineer assistant, his duties corresponding to those of his predecessor, Mr. Baillie. Mr. Wilson's service with the CN dates back to 1925 when he started as fourth engineer. He has had varied experience on most of the company's ships.

New chief engineer of the Prince George is Robert F. C. Baldrey, who has been "chief" on ss. Prince Rupert since 1950. He joined the company in 1927 as junior engineer on the Prince Rupert and later served in various capacities on other CN vessels here.

Ronald D. Crawford, who joined CNSS as second engineer on the Prince Rupert in 1948, has taken over as chief engineer on that ship. He has been second engineer on the Prince George for the past two years. Prior to joining the Canadian National, Mr. Crawford had extensive marine experience with other lines serving this coast.

The bride's mother, who has eight other children, will meet with Air Force officials tomorrow to take steps to have the marriage annulled.

**\$60,000 FOR SEATING**

Present plans are to erect 10,000 permanent and 30,000 semi-permanent seats at a cost of about \$60,000.

The track will have to be rebuilt and jumping pits moved to a different site. The gymnasium will probably be used for fencing, wrestling and perhaps boxing, although the latter is expected to go to a civic arena.

No location has yet been set for the game's swimming pool. There are reports it may be built at Riley Park near Little Mountain.
