vinegarbest bet for relishes for _winter RECIPE

CELERY RELISH

Chop 4 green peppers, 4 sweet red peppers and 2 lbs. (12 medium) onions. Combine 1/3 cup salt, 21/2 cups sugar, 1/3 cup mustard seed and I teaspoon tumeric. Blend in 11/4 cups light corn syrup, 33/4 cups Heinz Distilled White Vinegar and 4 cups water. Heat to boiling, covered. Add chopped peppers and onions, and 4 quarts (9 medium stalks) sliced celery. Simmer covered for 3 minutes. Quickly pack one hot, sterilized jar at a time. Fill to 1/8" from top. Be sure Vinegar solution covers the vegetables. Seal each jar at once. Yield: 10 pints.


