## Vancouver Gets Terrace Produce

## POWER MEN AT TERRACE

TERRACE—Intention of the British Columbia Power Commission to extend electric light and power service as extensively and expeditiously as possible throughout the community and into the environs was assured by G. Weston chairman of the Commission, and other officials who were here on Tuesday and addressed a well attended public meeting in the Oddfellows' Hall that night. Among other places, electricity would be made available to the Red Cross hospital, school buildings and civic centre, all in the old military camp area just east of town. Mr. Weston spoke of power matters in general with particular applications to such communities as this in which the Commission had taken over.

In addition to Mr. Weston, the legal adviser for the Commission, F. L. Shore, and T. M. Gibson, regional manager of the area between Hope and Terrace, were here and each spoke briefly. Prior to the meeting, there was a dinner by the executive council of the Terrace Board of Trade and the officials made a tour of the district.

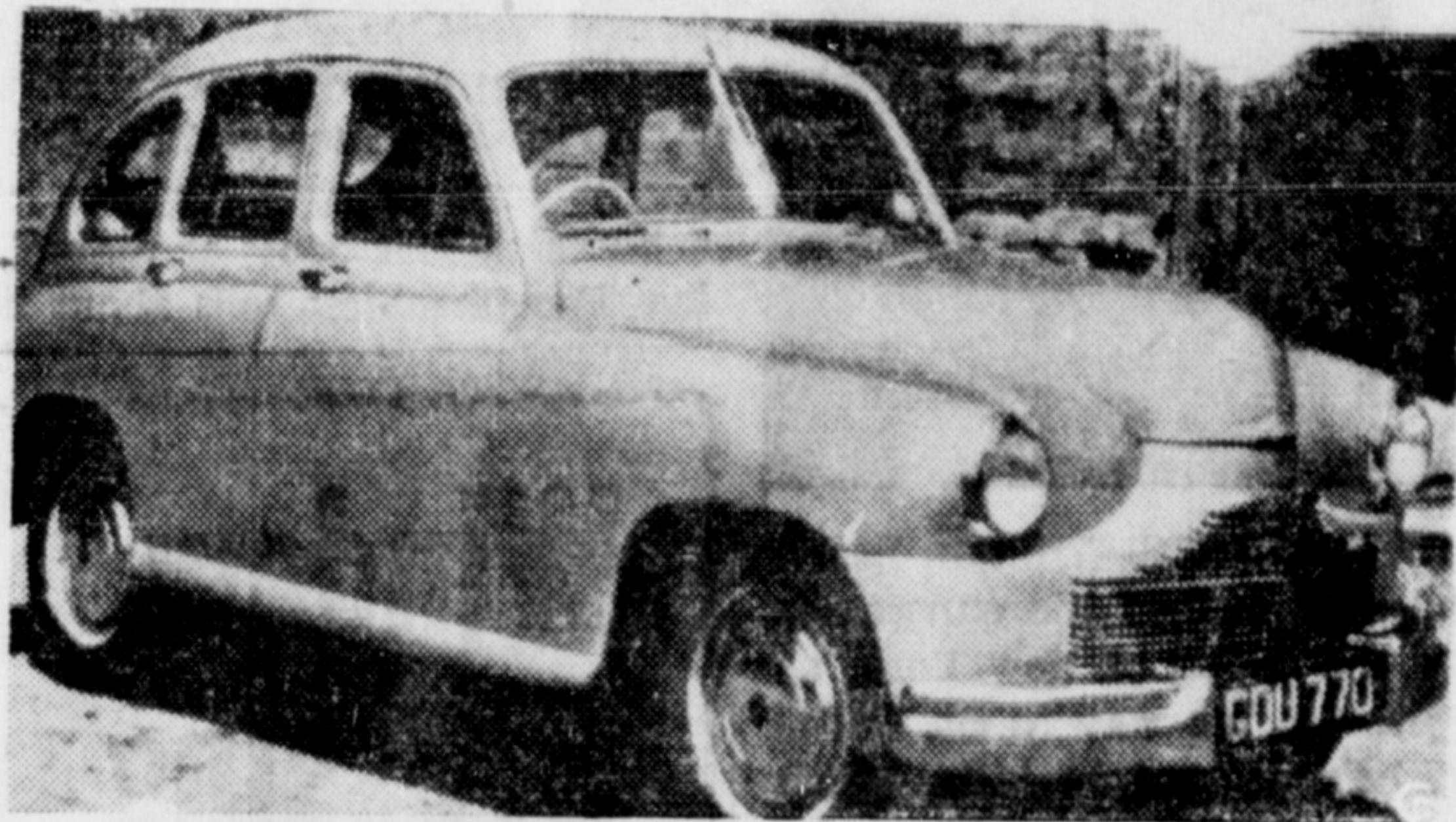

## H.M.S. Kenya Served from Arctic To Indian Ocean in War Years

First British warship to visit the port of Prince Rupert since before the second world war, H. M. S. Kenya will join on August 18 that company of Royal Navy Ships including H.M.S. York, Colombo, Danae, Dragon and others, that have dropped anchor here on goodwill cruises. Her commander, Captain Lennox Boswell, D.S.O., is a veteran of 33 years in the navy.

Here is an official biography of the ship which is of the same class as the Canadian cruiser, H.M.C.S. Uganda. H.M.S. Kenya was commissioned in August, 1940, and started war service almost immediately, escorting merchant convoys from the United Kingdom to Sierra Leone, at this time the scene of many sinkings by enemy submarines.

She completed the year by assisting in a hunt for an armed raider at Christmas time. The ship's company were not able to eat their Christmas dinner until February! The year 1941 was mostly spent in the Arctic Ocean, the ship being based for long periods in Iceland, where she took part in anti-merchant ship patrols, convoys to Murmansk and mine laying expeditions close to the enemy-occupied coast of Norway. All this was done under conditions of extreme cold and hardship, in very rough seas and men winds.

In September 1941 H.M.S. Kenya escorted a convoy of supplies to the island of Malta, repulsing submarine and aircraft attacks enroute. Returning to England a German supply ship was intercepted and sunk in the Atlantic. In November, 1941, saw H.M.S. Kenya bombarding enemy installations at Vardo, Norway, and finally leading a successful raid against the enemy at Vaagso. Here the ship was twice hit, sustaining slight damage but no casualties. The first few months of 1942 were again spent in the vicinity of Iceland, but in June H.M.S. Kenya took part in a second convoy to Malta. The convoy left Gibraltar on June 14, and was soon attacked by enemy aircraft and submarines. The ship was narrowly missed. Before turning back according to plan at least one enemy submarine had been sunk and 20 aircraft shot down. SURVIVED FIERCE DIVE BOMB ATTACK

Enemy attacks commenced with U-boats followed by aircraft of all types with the notorious dive-bombers in the majority. This battle raged for three days and nights, until more than half the merchant ships had been sunk and H.M.S. Kenya was the only cruiser left of the covering force, even she had a great hole in her bows from a torpedo hit. Five ships reached Malta but H.M.S. Kenya fought her way. Two weeks later H.M.S. Kenya set out in convoy for Malta again to fight what has been described as the "greatest convoy battle of the war."
