

Victory appears in sight for the long campaign of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce for equality with Vancouver under international load line regulations.

The Chamber has been advised by Hon. Ian Mackenzie, British Columbia's cabinet minister, that a technical committee of the Department of Transport has recommended to a general committee that consideration be given to extension of the line from the 51st parallel to the 56th parallel of north longitude and that representations along this line be made to the decennial international convention on Safety of Life at Sea to be held in London this fall.
